edge the receipt of your confidential communication of December 26th, with the Very respectfully, Your obd't serv't.

W. T. SHRRMAN, Gou'l. Mr. Sanisbury, of Delaware-That is simply an acknowledgment of the receipt of confidential communications and does not state the character of them.

West-When this resolution shall have been passed and all the information comes out the Senator will see that it was an acknowledgment of receipt of all orders and communications in reference to Gen. Sheridan being endezed to New Orleans; that is the fact and I know it to be so.


