The long continued demand of railroad legislation of the State, or for division in case that justice is The Austin Statesmas has shown more judgment, candor, and force than any other paper East of the Colorado in treating of this subject. It quotes as follows from the Rockport Transcript :

Piecussion Kesterday, Yesterday at 2 o'clock in the afternoon the new elected City Council of San Anto-nio met purmant to adjournment the day before, His Honor, Mayor French, presiding. After some unimportant business, the Mayor, by resolution, was authorized to borrow \$4000 to pay the city officials, the paupers, and the laborers in the em-

Mr. Mueuch offered a resolution that, in view of the financial condition of the city, no officers be appointed except those pres cribed and required by the Charter; which was passed unanimously....

Sec. 24 of the Charter, as recently amended, was then read by the Secretary at the request of the Mayor, pointing, out theofficers to be appointed, and the manner of their appointments Is says that the City Council "shall, upon nomination by the Mayor, proceed to elect," &co.

When the reading of the section was equaluded, the Mayor put in in nomination the name of Theodore Baldne, for City Clerk.

Maj. Teel's Argument Maj. Teel then arose, and in a very courteous manuer, stated that there was a difforence of apinion as to the powers of the Mayor'in the matter of "nominations" for city officers for "election" by the Conneil, He centended that the Mayor did not, under the Charter, have the sole right of nomination, as possessed by the President of the United States, and the Guverners of States. In the latter cases, he said, the President and the Governors had the power to "appoint" certain officers, "by and with the advice and consent of the Senate." The gam of the Mayor of the dity, he said, was not analagous. The Councily he said, had the right to "elect," not "confirm," on 'nominations by the Mayor," and that they were not shut up to the sominations the Mayor neight choose to make. If so, it could not be called an election. Haboued this matter might be settled now, at

the very outset of the new administration Mr. Degener, s Speech. Mr. Degener then replied in substance as foilows :-

The City Charter is explicit on the subject of filling vacancies, "Upon somination by the Mayor," the Council proceeds to "elect."


