#### Snow-Stides in Utah

SALT LAKE CITY, January 21. Another snow-slide occurred in Big Cottonwood caffon yesterday evening, near Richmond wine. A par ty of men, engaged in "sunking down" or in rawhides, were caught by the slide. Six men, named Thomas H. Broderick, William Ritter, Charles Dobble, James Breeze, Henry Atkins, and Reuben Moore, were carried away and their bodies have not yet been recovered. Geo. McCoulin and Thomas White were but were dug out, and their lives nection on both routes. were saved. The slide extended a distance of about one mile, and was about two hundred yards wide.

Yesterday the body of the six persons killed by the snow-slide at Alta City were recovered. It is convenience. supposed that many other persons have perished in the same manuer, but that their bodies are covered by the snow to such depth that they will not be found for some time. In one demolished house was found the body of Mrs. Carey sitting in a rocking chair with an infant clasped in her arms, and near her the bodies of her husband and little girl. They had all perished from suffocation by snow. At another house a man was dug out alive, while a man who had been sleeping beside him was found dead. The dead body of another Flour of various Brands, person was found in the vicinity of the house. There is much terror in the mining camps, and most of those who can get away will probably leave; but it is a difficult and dangerous andertaking to get away, as the people will have to walk, and run the gauntlet of snowslides on the way out of the canons.

#### What 2 Years' Time Wrought nto a Family Circle.

(ATCHINSON CHAMPION, January 22.) The organization of the Legis lature calls to mind a sad little bit of family history, involving the destruction of a happy and promising family circle within the short peri od of two years. Every one who attended upon the session of 1873 remembers a bright, slender girl who was chosen as one of the pages. She was a bright, frail little thing precocious and mentally vigorous far beyond her years, and possessed of a manner that won the hearts of all who ever looked upon her. She attended taithfully to her duties, and when the tiresome night sessions came on near the close, she was still there, as lively and bright as a young fawn, never seeming to tire, and doing more duty any other of the mes But the tender, nervous child was killing herself in ber exciting du ties, and after attending the Legis lature hall she was prostrated by an affection of the brain, and died amid the grief of the entire capital. The family were inconsolable, and it is believed that the mother never fully recovered from the shock; for, a few mouths after, the husband and father came home from his business one noon to find her dead upon the floor. The poor man was nearly crazy with the burden of his sorrow, but still remained at the capital, where he was employed in a bank. One day he was entrusted with a large sum of money to carry upon the street, and overcome by temptation he left the city wandered off to the Indian Territo. ry and Texas, where he was finally caught. He was brought back, tried, convicted and sentenced to the Penitentiary.

A few months after the remaining daughter was about to depart for Ohio, where she was to be married, but tell sick and died before her departure.

Taken all in all, this is one of the saddest and most touching scenes of family history that has ever come under our observation. Truly this is a sad world, and it is one of our greatest blessings that prosperous people have only an occasional glimpse of the sorrow that surround
