Europe Bristling with Bayonets.

The military contributor of the Cologne Gazette compares the present strength of the German army with that of the other leading European Powers. At the beginning of 1875 the German army consisted of 31,830 officers, 1,329,600 men, 314,970 horses, 2,700 field guns and 820 siege guns. Of these the number of troops available for service in the field within six weeks after the mobilization, including the transport and staff corps, 710,130 men, with 114,850 horses and 2,082 field guns. These figures do not include the fourth battalions, 3,400 officers and 162,100 men, formed in case of war, or the Landwehr to be raised under the new law, which would bring into the field a force, by the lowest computation, of 2,748,000 men and 300,000 horses. The total force at the disposal of Germany is, therefore, 38,948 officers and 1,694,200 men, excluding sergeants and the hospital corps, and not taking into account the probability that the estimated force of the Landwehr will be greatly exceeded when in the field.

Slavery in Siam.

The young King of Siam, who, fortunately for himself and his people, is able to read our books and write in our language, and who comprehended his reign by abolishing the practice of his courtiers and others prostrating themselves to the ground in his presence, has established a Legislative Council and a Privy Council to assist him with advice on all matters of importance. Already, too, he has let it be known that his purpose is to abolish slavery, a deeply rooted and most brutally enforced institution in Siam. He has had to begin with an alleviating measure, with a retrospective operation. He has decreed that children born of slave parents in Siam, on the 1st of April, 1868, shall become free, without let or hindrance, immediately on attaining their twenty-first year. The owners will receive compensation in each instance. This legislation does not prevent larger and still more ameliorative measures in time.

The Press-Gun Law.

A preamble and resolutions were adopted, stating that a condition of lawlessness and violence exists in Louisiana and other parts of the South, which seems to spring chiefly from prejudice against freedmen, and that it is the duty of the church to take the whole country, and its institutions, into consideration, and to see that the rights of the colored people are maintained, and that the people of the North and South, to assist in the maintenance of peace and order, and offering sympathy to those suffering fellow-citizens in the South, who are being treated with violence and injustice, and to the right and justice of the American people, which, though tardy, are sure.
