General News Items.

SUIT AGAINST GOV. HOFFMAN'S FATHER-IN-LAW. New York, April 29.—The New York Times, of to-morrow says the Attorney General has commenced suit against Hon. Starkweather, father-in-law of ex Gov Hoffman, for the sum of \$100,000, with interest and costs of suit.

OHAMA, April 29.—W. F. Jenney and party who have been appointed to make an accurate survey of the Black Hills country, passed through here to-day en route to Fort Laramie, where an escort of six companies of cavalry await their arrival.

THE following Indian news was obtained from the military headquarters at Fort Leavenworth: 125 Indians, composed of thirty-two Cheyennes, two Arapahoes, and ninety-one Kiowas and Comanches, will arrive here as prisoners, on Saturday, from Indian Territory.

GEN. CUSTAR'S EXPEDITION. St. Paul, Minn., April 29.—Gen. Custar is here. He does not expect to start on the expedition ordered by Gen. Sheridan for exploration of the regions far beyond Black Hills before the first of June.
