General News Items.

SUIT AGAINST GOV. HOFFMAN'S FATHER-IN-New York, April 29 .- The New York Times, of to-morrow says the Attorney General has commenced suit against Henry Starkweather, father in-law of ex Gov. Hoftman, for the sum of \$105,608, with interest and costs of suit. Starkweather was once at the head of the bureau for collection of assesments in the street department.

OHAMA, April 29 .- W. P. Jenny and party who have been appointed to make an accurate survey of the Black Hills country, passed through here to-day en route to Fort Laramie, where an encort of six companies of cavalry await their arrival, M DISPOSAL OF CAPTURED CHEYENNES. Leavenworth, April 29 .- A special to the Leavenworth Times, from Wichita, Kan., says a letter from the Cheyenne Agency, dated the 24th inst. states that 32 Cheyenne Indiane had left there in chains,

via Fort Sill, bound for Fort Leavenworth. The balance of the hostile Cheyennes now at the agency were moved the same day, and turned over by the Indian Agent to the military. There is also reliable intormation that a small band of Osages were ont with the party of hostile Cheyennes above Salt Plains, on the Cimaron. The Osages are preparing to go on a buffalo

The following Indian News was obtained from the military headquarters at Fort Leavenworth: 125 Indians, composed of thirty-two Cheyennes, two Araphoes, and ninety-one Kiowas and Comances, will arrive here as prisoners, on Saturday, from Indian Territory. Among them is the famous Chief, Medicine Water, who commanded the band that murdered a portion of a German family and took the, girls prisoners; also the Arapahoe Chief, White Bear. They are to be encamped on the reservation between this city and Fort Leavenworth, known as the Blue Grass, and will be guarded by a company of GEN, CUSTAR'S EXPEDITION.

St. Panl. Minu., April 29.-Gen. Custar is here. He does not expect to start upon the expedition ordered by Gen. Sheridan for exploration of the regions far beyond Black Hills before the first of June. The eavalry and infantry force is to start from Fort Lincoln at about that time, and before the expedition can move re enforcements must arrive from the South.

OMAHA, April 29 .- The parts of miners who were brought out of the Black Hills by the military passed through here today, They were generously furnished free transportation by the Chicago and Northwestern road to the Missouri Valley, lowa, they being penniless


