THE RIOT AT DUESOS AYRES .. FULL reports of the anti-Jesuit riot at Buenos Ayres state that the mob which attacked the Jesuite College numbered 20,000 persons. A public meeting was held in the theater, where speeches in denunciation of the Jesuita were made. The growd street rached to the Arghbishop's palace, which was sacked. The ery was then raised, "To the College." In two hours the College of San Salvador was entirely destroyed, excepting a portion of the faeads. Several of the Jesuit fathers were wounded; the others escaped with difficulty. The Minister of the Interior has since issued a proclamation announcing that the troubles are at an end, and that the Jesuita way return to their college without fear. The latter intended to rebuild the college and to reopen their day school at once. The cause of the outbreak appears to have been the transfer of the parish priest of the Church of St. Iguatins to the Cathedral and the creation of that church in a Jesuit mission. The liberal prapers of Buenes Ayres all protested against the introduction of the Jesuite, and the parishes also presented a remonstration to the government. The Archbishop of Buenos Ayres published an explanatory pastoral, which only increased the excitement, and which seems to have been




