RELIGIOUS NEWS.
The P. E. Congregation of South Carolina, under the colored churches, are representation.
The Rev. C. L. Robinson, of the Methodist Church, of New York City, has been called to succeed the Rev. W. H. Murray as pastor of the Park Street Church, in Boston.
The Archbishop of Canterbury has announced that a second Pan-Anglican Synod will be assembled in 1877, when steps will be taken to secure the attendance of the Colonial Bishops.
It is reported that nine hitherto unknown fragments of the Codex Sinaiticus have been discovered by Prof. Brugsch, who accompanied the Grand Duke, of Mecklenburg-Schwerin, in his visit to the convent of Mount Sinai.
The Congregationalist this week reports further additions to the churches, aggregating 1,243, mostly in New England. From other sources, we learn of some 2000 more, added to churches of various denominations, making a total gain within a year of at least 15,000.
The General Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, which meets in Baltimore, May 26, represents twenty three districts Synods, 762 ministers, 1,228 churches, 117,000 communicants. It is expected 500 ministers and laymen will visit Baltimore as delegates to the General Convention.
The Synod of the Bishop of London established a fund, since known as the Bishop of London's fund, for the purpose of building churches and schools in his diocese. The sum voluntarily subscribed amounts now to \$2,500,000, and 112 churches, as well as 108 new schools, have been built with it, besides the addition of 200 clergy to the diocese.
The total number of native Christians in India in 1871, was 318,362; the number of native ordained ministers was 271. These people contributed \$79,568. The rate of increase from 1857 to 1861 was 53 per cent, and from 1861 to 1871, 61 per cent. Of the missionaries 131 are American, and 233 British, which under the circumstances, is doing well for America.
The President of Paris, Bazill, has ordered the prosecution of Father Sebastian Borg, the present Governor of the Diocese of Paris, for the illegal exercise of his functions. Father de Castello had continued his direction of the affairs of the diocese, although committed to trial for disobeying the order to raise the interdict pronounced against the Præmonstratenses. His appeal against his excommunication has been rejected.
The letter addressed by the Pope to Victor Emmanuel, protesting his veto the clause of the concordat bill which rendered the clergy liable to military service, produced a sensation in Italy. The letter reminded the King of the many saints there had been in his family, and urged that the clause would destroy the Church. It has elicited the extreme parties upon both sides, neither of whom desire a reconciliation of the papacy and the monarchy. The Senate relieved the King of the necessity of taking any action in the matter by rejecting that clause of the bill. A number of petitions from the clergy had been sent to the Senate.

THE OUTRAGE MILL.

Killings, Shootings, and Mob During the Past Week, in Texas.

Clippings from Democratic Newspapers.

This "outrage mill" during the past week seems to have been given several rapid twists, as we have accounts of a massacre of negroes in Robertson County, and the fruits of two or three mobs. Our sources of information are strictly democratic, and the incidents enumerated are only samples:

FORT WORTH, May 19.—A young man named Kyle, while attempting to escape arrest near Mansfield, on Saturday night, was shot and killed by a constable.—Dallas Herald.

ANOTHER MURDEROUS SHOT.—W. G. Eades, of the large saddlery store on Elm street, was shot in his own home about 10 o'clock on Wednesday night by his brother-in-law, J. D. Padgett. Sheriff Berkley repaired to the spot, and after some time elicited the fact that the assassin was Padgett. The true cause of the difficulty is unknown. After the shooting Padgett went to the stable of Work & Son, got a horse and left. At this writing he has not been captured. Let the officers and citizens hunt till he has been found, and safely hold him till he answers to the law for the crime against society and God.—Dallas paper.

An unfortunate difficulty occurred on last Sunday near the farm of R. H. Parker, between a little orphan boy named McBride, an adopted son of Mr. Parker, and a negro boy about sixteen years of age, in which the latter lost his life by knife wounds. It seems from what we can learn that they, with other boys, went to the tank for the purpose of bathing when the difficulty arose, during which young McBride cut the negro in three places with a small pocket knife, resulting in death next morning. No one but more children were present, and they differ in their statements in regard to the origin of the difficulty. McBride is at this time out of reach of the officers, but we are told will be present and ready to answer at the next term of our Criminal Court.—McKinney Enquirer.

THE MEXICAN, Jesus, who shot Clark's cook and was captured by Culver's company, escaped from his custodians on the way to Corpus Christi, or at least has not been brought in.—Later.—Mr. Lawrence Dunn reports that while bringing his prisoner in town last night, in company with his brother Matt, at the old Cody place, a number of men coming from the direction of Corpus Christi charged upon them, firing pistols. It the excitement of the moment Jesus escaped. Dunn does not know who the parties were, or where they came from.—Corpus Christi Times.

FOUND DEAD.—While a traveler this morning was coming in on the Laredo road, at the Chocolate Motts, about twelve miles from town, he found a Mexican lying on the roadside, dead, having been completely stilled with bullets. Who committed the homicide, or for what purpose, of who the killed man was, is not known. The whole matter is shrouded in impenetrable mystery. Will this killing ever cease? God only knows how many more have been killed within the last two months, or how many more will be unless some steps are taken to prevent the butchery. A state of actual war would be preferable a thousand times over than this era of midnight assassination.—It.

ATTEMPT TO MURDER.—Two men giving their names as Hill and Colburn were arrested at the Western Hotel in this city last Monday morning. The parties are reported to have met a negro in Clay county, near Red River, and that upon learning he had some \$300 in cash, a watch etc., they knocked him in the head, robbed him, and left him for dead under a brush pile. They made a mistake, or were unfamiliar with the art of negro cranialogy, for no sooner were they out of sight than was Ebony out of that brush pile. Ham told the joke to the officers, who immediately started in pursuit of the ignorant wretches. They were traced to Gainesville, and were found "drunk and diseased" in \$60 worth of new clothes. With the assistance of Sheriff Morris they were induced to go west immediately. Most of the money was recovered. Ham is happy, but thinks they ought to "change dem clo'es."—Galveston Gazette.

MARRIAGE STOPPING, May 21.—Early yesterday morning, as a couple of gentlemen were coming to town, they were stopped to see a man, name unknown, hanging to a tree, about dead, a mile and a half from town. His hands were tied behind his back, and his horse tied to a tree near by. He is supposed to be one of a band of horse thieves.—Special to Gal. News.

GRAY EXCITEMENT AT GROESBECK.—R. M. Clendinning was killed this morning by the notorious Merriek Trammel. A party of citizens went out last night under the direction of W. C. Parker and Barrett, Deputy Sheriffs, for the purpose of arresting Trammel. He was found in his house and the house surrounded. After parleying a while on the outside, he consented to surrender, on condition they would not mob him. Trammel admitted Barrett into his house, and being assured by Barrett that he would be treated as a prisoner, he came to the door with a sixteen shooting Henry rifle in his hand. Constable Sharp attempted to disarm him, and when he took hold of the gun, Trammel wrested the gun, ran back into the house, closed the door and shot Clendinning through a crack in the house. The ball entered his side and passed through his body, causing almost instant death. The crowd became panic-stricken, and were thrown into some confusion, thus giving Trammel a little time. No one saw him except F. Varber, who fired several shots. It is not known whether Trammel was hurt or not. W. Trammel is said to have been killed. Great excitement prevails at this time, and every man that could muster a gun and horse is out in search of Trammel.

REPRESENTS.—The latest from Groesbeck reports that a large number of white men crossed the Navarro bottom and

vicinity on yesterday, and failed to discover any other of the murderers, but that Mrs. House, becoming unwell, started for home late in the evening, and while en route, came up with some eight or nine of them, and was instantly shot by them, and his horse killed. His wound was in the hip, and not thought to be at all serious. Telegrams were sent to this place last night for arms to guard Groesbeck, and nearly all the men and arms were being used in the hunt, and the town was wholly unprotected. The hunt continues today. The cave where Merriek was said to have been secreted, was searched, but no one found in or near it. Considerable excitement all over the central portion of the county, on account of the affair.

RELIGIOUS NEWS.
The F. R. Coffey, of South Carolina, refused the solemn church services.
The Rev. C. L. Robinson, of the Memorial Church of New York City, has been called to succeed the Rev. W. H. Murray as pastor of the Park Street Church, in Boston.

The Archbishop of Canterbury has announced that a second Pan-Anglican Synod will be assembled in 1877, when steps will be taken to secure the attendance of the Colonial Bishops.
It is reported that new hitherto unknown fragments of the Codex Bezae Cantabrigiae have been discovered by Prof. Brugsch, who accompanied the Grand Duke, Duke Mecklenburg-Strelitz, in his visit to the tomb of Mount Sinai.

The Congregationalist this week reports further additions to the churches, aggregating 1,945, mostly in New England. From other sources we learn of some 2000 more, added to churches of various denominations, making a total gain within a year of about 15,000.

The General Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, which meets in Baltimore, May 25, represents twenty three district synods, 760 ministers, 1238 churches, 117,029 communicants. It is expected 250 ministers and laymen will visit Baltimore as delegates to the General Convention.

Ten years ago the Bishop of London established a fund, since known as the Bishop of London's fund, for the purpose of building churches and schools in his diocese. The sum voluntarily subscribed amounts to \$1,200,000, and 113 churches, as well as 100 new schools, have been built with it, besides the addition of 230 clergy to the diocese.

The total number of native Christians in England in 1874 was 318,334, the number of native baptized ministers was 571. These people contributed \$79,500. The rate of increase from 1851 to 1871 was 53 per cent, and from 1861 to 1871, 61 per cent. Of the missionaries 131 are American, and 333 British, which under the circumstances, is doing well for America.

The President of Para, Brazil, has ordered the prosecution of Father Sebastian Borg, the present Governor of the Diocese of Para, for the illegal exercise of his functions. Father de Castello had continued his direction of the affairs of the bishopric, although committed to trial for disobeying the order to resign, the interdiction pronounced against the Roman pontiff. His appeal against his interdiction has been rejected.

Jan lately addressed by the Pope to Victor Emmanuel, directing him to veto the claims of the concession bill which rendered the clergy liable to military service, produced a sensation in Italy. The letter reminded the King of the many salutes there had been in the family, and urged that the clause would destroy the Church. It has displeased the extreme party, and both sides, neither of whom desire a reconciliation of the papacy and the monarchy. The Senate refused the King of the necessity of taking any action in the matter by rejecting that clause of the bill. A number of petitions from the clergy had been sent to the Senate.

MURKIN'S ARREST AND ESCAPE.
WELLS, May 24.
Government officers captured the notorious murderer, Pete Murkin, near Montgomery, last night. All was rejoiced and they thought they had him sure, but the bird escaped again. How Murkin escaped his escape I cannot, at this writing, tell, but he is again at large, and as he is in the neighborhood of the "Big Thicket," he can defy capture forever if he will go into it.

The terrible effects of the use of tobacco are graphically illustrated in the case of a lady in this country, who began to use it at the age of sixty, and is now over one hundred and ten years old. If she had left tobacco alone she might have been a thousand years old, but she would not do it, tobacco—*San Antonio Journal.*
