The Secre ary of War has sent me your dispatch of the 21st inst., from Sloax City. General Terry, commanding the department of Bakota, has directed that the Gordon mining party be released, if the capture was made outside of the Sioux reservation; but in case it was made inside, to require a promise from each individual composing it, not to violate the conditions of the treaty of 1869 with the Sioux Indians, which torbide any trespass on the part of the whites until the government gives permission. The Gordon party, or say other party, hee no more right, under the treaty of 1869, to go to the Bighorn than they have to go to the Black Hills, and it might just as well be understood at once that it, or any other party. will not be permitted to go to these places, until instructions which now govern the military are revoked.



The Secre ary of War has sent me your dispatch of the 21st inst., from Sioux City, General Terry, commanding the department of Bakota, has directed that the Gorden mining party be released, if the capture was made outside of the Sionx reservation; but in case it was made inside, to require a promise from each individual composing it, not to violate the conditions of the treaty of 1869, with the Sioux Indians, which torbids any treapass on the part of the whites, until the government gives permission. The Gordon party, or any other party, has no more right, under the treaty of 1809, to go to the Bighorn than they have to go to the Black Hills. and it might just as well be understood at once that it, or any other party, will not be permitted to go to these places, until instructions which now govern the military are revoked.
