Resolutions adopted by the Republican State Convention held at Hempstead on

the 25th of June, 1875. Resolved, 1st, That the Democracy of this State, having a few months since secured possession of the government by profuse promises of reform and retrenchment, has increased the officers to be supported by the people; has doubled the public debt, and, though they have abolished the schools which under a Republican administration caused the most of the tax then collected, has actually increased taxation and extended its reach every where to the small possessions of the poor,

2. That this convention will make recommendation to Republicana in regard to voting for or against the proposed constitutional convention, leaving that question to the individual judgment of each voter.
