





THE GRAND SCOUT. HEADQUARTERS DEP'T OF TEXAS, & San Antonio, May 31, 1875. Lieutenant Colonel W. R. Shafter, 24th

Infantry, is charged with the control of active operations in the field, under such instructions as he may receive from these Headquarters, with a command constituted as tollows, viz:

Companies A. P. G, Land L, 10th Cavalry, (Fort Concho;) Co. C. 10th Cavalry, (Fort McKavett;) Ces. D and F, 24th Infantry, (Fort Dunesu;) Co. A, 25th Infan try, (Ff. Stockton, Texas;) and all available Seminole Scouts under First Lieutenant J L Bullis, 24th Infautry.

The troops will rendezvous at Fort encho, reporting to Lieutenant Colonel R Shafter at that place not later than 37 C 20th day of June. Every company will carry (in wagon) two bundred rounds of animunition, and each will march, practicable, with at least lifty serviceable enlisted men -- when necessary, men being temporarily attached; in this case, prefer once will be given to those who volumteer. Clothing for four months' field servi vice, blanks, &c., for rendering the neces sary returns, and the requisite horse and muld-shoes and nails, will be carried by each company.

Pack mules will be issued at that rate of one to every five cavalrymen and scouts: in addition, one to each company for officers to be taken, when on hand, from the posts to which the companies belong

Shulter tents for troops, and limited tentage for hospital purposes and officers use at Camp Supply, will be furnished in addition to two wall tents and one paulin to each company.


