Hon. Lorenzo Danford was made temporary chairman, and made an earnest speech. A special committee was appointed to invite General Sherman, now in the city, to visit the Convention, and the morning was given to routine business.

COLUMBUS, June 2.-At the afternoon session of the State Republican Convention, General Sherman accepted the invitation to visit the convention, and being outhusiastically received, spoke in substance as fellows :

"GENTLEMEN: I confess to feeling scared and if could with decency have avoided this call, I would have done it, for this i the first time I ever steed in a political convention. I have been raised a soldier, and taught to obey orders. When you, gentlemen, have chesen governors and legislators, it is our duty and pleasure to obey the laws made by them. I came here o bury my aid and old staff officer, Colonel ames McCoy, whom so many of you knew. I have seen him laid away in a beautiful, quiet spot, just east of the city, and must leave this afternoon. I come here simply as a mark of frespect to the gentlemen who compose this convention. Ohio has now come to be regarded as the most important State in the Union. I hope you will all be endowed with wiedom sufficient for the important duty which has called you together to-day. Again

Hood's broken and grushed veterans across the raging Tennesses, over crazy pontoons, nor on the saddest of aff days, whon at Greenville, Ala., I put my parole in my pocket, saw my comrados lay down their arms, our color-bearer fold and place in his bosom our ball riddled flag, and in mute serrow turned my horse toward the home of my boyhood, midst a very lively appearance to day, being the cedars and limestone grags of the old Volunteer State. I say, not even in this bour did I ever lose faith in the destiny of the South, or the unity of the nation. To me the war, its causes, and its results, have been an episode both painful and necessary in the unfolding drams of our ma-


