Cleveland, G., June 10. - The National Pigeon-shooting Tournament commenced this morning, under the most favorable auspices. Shooting began at 9 a. m., and continued without intermission until 7 o'clock in the evening. The attendance was large, the weather fine, and the birds good and strong flyers. The prizes offered were: First, \$250; second \$200; third \$250 \$200,000 coin | HOUSES & LANDS fourth, \$100; fifth, \$50. There were 139 entries for the day's shoot, being the largest ever made for one day's shoot in this country. The shooting was aplendid. The contest for first money was very close and exciting. Eighteen men killed ten birds each at \$1 yards; 13 fell off at \$6, and 2 at 31, on the first five birds, leaving 3 men that had killed 20 birds without a miss. The first prize was won by T. J. Puth, of Franklin, Ky., who killed \$5 straight. Secand money was contested for by 98 men who had killed 9 each at 21 yards, and was won by Cook Corzens, of Detroit. The third prize was won by Mr. Hall of Toledo. The fourth was divided between Hamilton, of Buffalo, and Langdon, of Cincinnati. The ties for the fifth prize will be shot off in the morning. The tournsment will probably be the most successful one ever lists in the United States.




