General News Items.

SHERIDAN'S WEDDING JOURNEY. The wedding journey of the Lieutenant General and his wife was entirely unlike the customary expedition which newly wedded people make.

The carriage they used, to go with the horses, was a gift from the bridegroom to his wife. General Sheridan's residence is a singular two-story brick edifice, standing alone.

He also gives the name of two others, Wilson and Ludlow. Wilson is a fugitive from justice, and his companions are likewise outlaws, who have had their headquarters in the upper country on the Llano.

A CURIOUS COINCIDENCE.—A gentleman was expecting a diamond ring by express; he was notified of a package valued at \$200. He called, opened it, and found a diamond ring similar to his own, and accompanying it was a love letter full of rets; his wonder grew; he knew no such man; his ring had been left with a banker; he examined the ring and came to the conclusion that it was not meant for him, and took the package back to the express office. There some one suggested of a similar name in the city. He was hunted by him, recognized him as an old love gift, and the letter explained all. A glass of champagne ended the dilemma.

BURGLARS AT WORK.—A nice spread, the safe blows open and robbed.

This morning (Thursday), considerable excitement existed over the discovery of a very daring and successful burglary committed on the grocery store of L. Brian & Bro., on Alamo Plaza. The establishment is the last store on the block leading from Alameda street, is within one hundred steps of the Menger Hotel; a hundred and fifty steps of the Alamo market, and, in fact, one of the most public of all the situations in the city.

After midnight, (and some of the butchers who were already at work) say about three o'clock, they heard an explosion, but paid no attention to it. The watchman at the Menger thinks he heard it about two o'clock. Certain it is, the police did not hear it, and the burglary was not discovered until the boy came, about five o'clock, to open the store, when, upon opening the front door, he found the store full of smoke and the back door open and the safe a wreck.

Visiting the scene of the exploit, we found the safe to be one of Herring's, with a key-hole sufficiently large to put in a charge of powder. The door was a complete wreck, left hanging by a single hinge. The charge had been well calculated, and left the safe a complete wreck. A boat \$250 was taken from the safe, while the cash drawer containing about \$40 was not opened, the concession evidently injuring the lock, and the burglar, not desiring to stay any longer, left it untouched.

Nothing was taken from the store, and even Mr. Brian's watch, hanging on the door, was unharmed. The burglar entered the back door by prying off the fastening, then breaking the glass and entering in this way.

There is a regular band of thieves in the city, and this will not be the last exploit we shall hear of.

THE FIGHT WITH THE HIGHWAYMEN.—We are in receipt of a letter from one of the participants in the fight with the highwaymen, above Kerrville. It seems that the banditti showed considerable pluck and fought their pursuers for an hour, and finding that they were about to be overpowered they left one of their wounded on the field, abandoned their horses, and escaped into the dense thickets.

The silver mine at the mouth of Lost Creek, where it crops out of the mountain is ten feet wide and appears to be one of the richest things in Texas. Twenty tons of the ore has been shipped, which looks as if the company leasing it had confidence in it. The specimens analyzed by them, it is said, showed a large per cent. of silver. The Lost Creek section of this country is rich in minerals, silver, copper, manganese, iron and plumbago all being found in small quantities near its waters. Five miles from Fort Mason, the Murrill & Thomas silver mine, is perhaps the only mine of the kind in the State that is worked regularly; but preparation for mining on a large scale are in progress in several places.

### General News Items.

**SHERIDAN'S WEDDING JOURNEY.**  
The wedding journey of the Lieutenant General and his wife was entirely unlike the customary expedition which newly wedded people make. After remaining while at the residence of General Rucker they left the house, attended by Colonel and Mrs. Mike F. Sheridan and General and Mrs. McFoley, and were driven to the residence of General Sheridan, 708 Michigan avenue. The carriage they used, together with the horse, was a gift from the bridegroom to his wife. General Sheridan's residence is a square two-story brick edifice, standing alone. It is very handsomely furnished, and looks, in its every appointment, the home of a military man. The bridal chamber is furnished in blue and gold, and has a pale drapery with blue vine border. Elegant pictures adorn the walls, and articles of vertu are placed in every conceivable nook of the room. It was to this home, so exact and magnificent in its every appointment, the redoubtable warrior took his bride, and there the wedding journey ended.

The attempt of the Republican party, not only in Ohio, but throughout the country, to make political capital out of war upon our foreign-born citizens of Roman Catholic belief, deserves the reprobation of every good citizen, a reprobation which we are sure it will receive at the polls.

**THE ROMAN HARVEST IN AMERICA.**  
The Pope, in reply to an address presented him on the 1st instant from students of colleges in America, thanking him for the elevation of Archbishop McCloskey to the Cardinalate, alluded to the excellent reception given to an appointment in America, and added:

"It seems that the harvest in America is ripe, and laborers are wanting. You are preparing yourselves for that work. Preach especially by example in order to convert that great nation."

**SPAIN.—PROTESTANT BOOKS SEIZED.**  
Santander, June 10.—A box containing a number of Protestant books consigned to an American resident at this place, has been embargoed at the Customhouse. The act has been brought to the attention of Mr. Cushing, United States Minister at Madrid.

**GERMANY.—ANOTHER BISHOP RECALLED.**  
Berlin, June 10.—The tribunal at Posen has sentenced the Prince Bishop, Dr. Forster, of Breslau, to a fine of 2000 marks, or 133 days' imprisonment, for illegally excommunicating a priest.

**SINGULAR ACCIDENT.**  
A lady residing on Main street, yesterday met with a very novel and painful accident. While passing over, she struck her head against something, driving a hair pin into her head some two inches or more, inflicting a most serious and, it is feared, dangerous wound. Medical attendance was promptly summoned to the lady's aid, and at a late hour, as evening was setting quietly, though by no means out of danger.—*Dallas Herald.*

**PIG-GUN SHOOTING.**  
Cleveland, O., June 10.—The National Pig-gun shooting tournament commenced this morning, under the most favorable auspices. Shooting began at 8 a. m., and continued without intermission until 7 o'clock in the evening. The attendance was large, the weather fine, and the birds good and strong flyers. The first offered were: First, \$200; second \$200; third \$150; fourth, \$100; fifth, \$50. There were 120 entries for the day's shoot, but the largest ever made for one day's shoot in this country. The shooting was splendid. The contest for first money was very close and exciting. Eighteen men killed birds, each at 91 yards; 13 fell at 82 and 2 at 51, on the first 50 birds, losing 3 men that had killed 20 birds with a miss. The first prize was won by P. Path, of Franklin, Ky., who killed 25 aught. Second money was contested for by 20 men who had killed 9 each at 21 yds, and was won by Cook Cozzen, of Drott. The third prize was won by Mr. H. of Toledo. The fourth was divided between Hamilton, of Buffalo, and Laugel, of Cincinnati. The ties for the 50th bird will be shot off in the morning. A tournament will probably be the most successful one ever held in the United States.

In 1873 Governor Allen had plenary over 5000 of 517 votes. Therefore cast for Stewart, Prohibitionist, 108 votes, and for Collins 10,109 votes. Ten was therefore in a minority on the vote of 10,516. This year there will no Prohibitionists to speak of, and fourth ticket at all; and there is a probability that the northern part of the vote will poll one of the old-fashioned Union votes. It is a very pleasing prospect.

**The Big coat to hold on.**

In consequence of the Rio Grande news, we understand that orders have reached this military headquarters to the effect that the big Indian hunt hold on for a little while. It may be that the troops will be needed on the Mexican border.

A gentleman has informed us we were wrong in our allusion to Gen. Duff Green being the man whom Sam Houston called "Dog Green," that man was, "Thomas Jefferson Green," but Houston, in his famous proclamation offering premiums to all the liars who were defaming him, offered a "file of the United States Telegraph bound in 'dog,' the paper edited by Duff Green.

The presence of General Sherman at the Convention has been understood as an indication that, although attached to the Catholic communion, he is sound on the school question, as indeed all sensible Catholics are.—*Holland Herald, Vermont.* General Sherman is not, nor never was attached to the Catholic communion. His estimable wife and family are members of the Roman Catholic Church. The General belongs to the "big church."

At the final celebration of the Lee and Jackson Literary Society of the Wesleyan Female Institute of Staunton, Va., the salutatory essay was delivered by Miss Lizzy Perry, of Galveston, and the annual address by Hon. E. Q. Mills, of Texas. ## Burglary.

The opening of Mr. Briam's store and the robbing of his safe, suggests some reflections. It would be well for our merchants and business men to heed.

1st, If you keep a safe, be certain it is one of the best.

2nd, If you keep money in your safe have a good watchman attend with one or two lively little dogs that keep awake or wake easily.

So much for the safe part. Now how about your doors. They are carefully locked or bolted, but there is scarcely a door in the city that will withstand for five minutes the skillful manipulation of practiced burglar.

Every door should be examined and made strong and all cheap locks thrown away.  
It is a rare thing taking our experience for ten years for a store to be opened and robbed. In 1860, Lewis mill was entered and the miller murdered and two small safes tampered with by the murderer who proved to be a fugitive Maximilian adventurer.

A few months ago Mrs. Schmitt's hotel was robbed of \$500, but they had no safe. Within a few weeks, two establishments, Mr. Kerns, and the Crystal Saloon have been opened and the safes tampered with but the burglars were not successful, the safes being the Hall pattern.

Our citizens generally, from time immemorial, have been careless. Their stores are insecurely guarded and every private residence in the city is left open for the full play of the breeze. It has been a happy and rarely disturbed feeling of security. But our condition is bound to change with the approach of the Railroad and we may expect to be visited by all kinds of civilized thieves. It behooves our police force to be wide awake.

**Dick Hubbard.**

That jolly human experiment, Dick Hubbard, has distinguished himself as one of the mileage grabbers of the 14th Legislature.

He drew for 850 miles from Tyler to Austin, when in 1870 the Republican member from the same place only drew for 650.

Recently Dick has been having himself pulled up; still further testing the tension of his overtaxed skin; and it becomes the occasion for the *Belton Journal*, (strictly orthodox democratic) to stick a pin into the political bubble. It happens in this wise:

The *Sunny South*, published at Atlanta, Georgia, devotes a page to the life of A. Gov. H. B. Hubbard. The paper is also embellished with one of the finest engravings of the distinguished gentleman. Governor Hubbard is a native of Georgia, and the Georgians are very proud of him.—*Austin Statesman.*  
To have made the picture perfect, in one hand he should have held his gavel entwined with internal bonds, and in the other copies of the *Saturday* defending his casting vote. Then beneath this picture of the noble Roman should have been inscribed, "this is the Hon. Richard B. Hubbard, the present Lieutenant Governor of Texas; the only lieutenant governor that ever drew mileage; the man who in one single year increased the area of his state at least one hundred miles, and that, too, without war or bloodshed." (See records of Comptroller's office, by which it will be seen that he drew mileage for about one hundred miles more than it used to be from Austin to Tyler.) Hurrah for Hubbard! But how about the mileage?—*Belton Journal.*

**The Situation on the Rio Grande.**

The *Galveston News* has a dispatch from Brownsville, June 14th, which states that one of the Mexicans of the party attacked and routed by McNally, escaped wound and had received surgical attention in Matamoros.

Cortina is very mad, and the Mexican papers charge that the raiders were assassinated while asleep. Gen. Cortina is arming, and preparing for revenge.  
Gen. Fiero is on the road from Monterey with three thousand men. And it is reported that he comes to attend to Cortina, although we have information here that Fiero has no such force and has been six months on the road in accordance with orders issued by the Central Government.

Troops are on the alert and the people of Brownsville have adopted measures of defence.  
The situation is very serious, and it looks like the people of the lower Rio Grande. Mexican and American were about to be fully gratified by a little war business.

## Races.

It has been suggested that our Jockey Club make up and inaugurate a series of races for the amusement of our citizens.

There are quite a number of trotters and runners belonging to private gentlemen who are sadly in need of having the conceit taken out of them. The track is one of the finest in the State and should not be allowed to lie idle. A moderate gate fee could be exacted to enable the club to pay all expense attending the care of the buildings, grounds and track.

The days are warm but the evenings are delightful and afford ample time for a drive to the track and a race.

The season is dull and some public spirit should be shown by some body to keep up the circulation.

**General News Items.**

The Ohio campaign starts out very well for the Republicans. The Democrats are evidently alarmed at the nomination of Hayes, because they know that it means a full Republican vote, which in Ohio always means 40,000 Republican majority. B. L. Allen will not be as formidable a candidate as he was two years ago. He stands on the exploded platform of unlimited currency expansion, and the Democrats of the East cannot afford to let him be elected on any such doctrine.—*St. Louis Globe.*

The *Toledo Blade* says: "With a reasonably full vote, which will be given, the Republicans can carry Ohio next fall by a handsome majority. Everything is favorable for such a result, and Republicans in sister States may confidently look for the redemption of Ohio from Democratic corruption in October."

BALTIMORE, June 10.—The graves of the Confederate dead at London Park were decorated with flowers this afternoon under the auspices of the Society of the Army and Navy of the Confederate States in Maryland. The oration was delivered by Major Robert Skiles, of Virginia. Union soldiers were present, who decorated the Confederate monument, and the Confederate soldiers decorated the monument to Union dead.

A CORRESPONDENT of the Springfield Republican, who knew Mrs. Lincoln intimately, refutes many of the stories once current about that unfortunate lady. About the charge that Mrs. Lincoln sent information to the enemy by her sister, who had recently been in Washington, the writer says: "To me she said that she had refused to see that sister, although General of the Union army had been sent to solicit an interview. 'I would not let her cross my threshold, nor any one who was an enemy of my country,' said she."

When a friend prepared a careful contradiction of some of the reports and showed it to Mrs. Lincoln, the latter thanked her, and told her that she appreciated her motives, but she still felt sure that it was best for her that no friend should defend her or say anything about her in print; she had a right to privacy, and she could not allow even her friends to break over the rule which she, with her husband's approval, had laid down—which was utter silence in the press on her part.

**SYMPATHY WHERE NONE IS NEEDED.**

It was reported that the Sisters of Charity had been expelled from Mexico. Much sympathy has been expressed for them. An indignation meeting, presided over by Gen. Rosecrans, was held in San Francisco on their arrival there. But the truth is, they were not expelled any more than the Protestant missionaries were. They left rather than obey the laws of Mexico. The Protestants obey the laws and remain. These laws embrace the following particulars: No "holidays" but the Sabbath and those appointed by the government. No religious processions outside of the inclosures of religious establishments. No distinctive religious dress or habit to be worn in the streets. No processions made to religious establishments or orders to be legalized. All religious establishments must be open to the inspection of Government officers on demand. If the Mexican Government has found it necessary to make these laws, we can not find fault with them if some persons leave the country rather than conform to them.—*Republican Missionary Magazine.*

**CALIFORNIA WHEELS INTO LINE.**

San Francisco June 11.—The Republican State Convention met at Sacramento yesterday afternoon. Sargent presided. The convention adopted strong anti-railroad resolutions, which were supported by Graham in a vigorous speech denouncing the Central Pacific. Faches was withdrawn as candidate for Governor. T. G. Phelps was nominated by acclamation. James M. Hayes was nominated for Lieutenant Governor; O. H. Hallet for Secretary of State; Comptroller, J. J. Green; Surveyor, R. E. Gardner; Treasurer, Wm. Bookman; Attorney General, E. D. Sawyer; Clerk of Supreme Court, Grant I. Taggart; Superintendent Public Instruction, Ezra C. Carr.
