SUICIDE OF A WEALTHY BOSTONIAN. Boston, June 12 - Joseph P. Gardner, wealthy and prominent citizen of Boston, was found dead in the woods near Beverly to-day, lying on his back, lis r. volver in his hand pointing toward his head, four chambers of which were empty. There is every indication of his having committed ted suicide. Deceased was living at his country seat, and left home last evening for a walk, after which he was not seen again till found to-day. He was a graduate of Harvard, class 47. No cause can be assigned for the act, as he was in affinent circumstances and all his relations in life apparently pleasant.

LOSS OF VALUABLE HORSE. New York, June 12 .- The trotting mare Valuation Haid, owned by Simon B Bonne, of Flushing, and valued at \$12,000; was found in her pastare, yesterday with her leg broken, and she was killed.

MEXICAN CLAIMS COMMISSION. Washington, June 13. - The Mexican Claims Commission, which adjourned you terday until next November, has so far fluished up its business that but a few days work will be necessary to dispuse of the small remainder. The Umpire, Sir Edward Thornton, British Minister, has an immence amount of labor before him, but he will dispose of it prior to next February, when the Commission expires, as previously stated in these dispatches, Nearly every case has been sent to the Umpire, in consequence of the obstinate partiality of the Mexican Commissioner, Zamacona, who has acted more in the capacity of an advocate than a fuller, showing scarcely any disposition to yield a point in suver of the American claimants, but persistently contending for awards to all Mexican ctaimants. The importance of the action of this commission is small to the United States as compared with the interests of Mexico, because the number of claims of Mexican citizens is very meager, and the amount of money involved is as ten to one in favor of the United States elaimants.

PALACE CAR PRIVILEGES An important railroad suit has just been decided at Auburn, in which William B. Torne, of that city, was plaintiff, and the New York City and Hudson River Railroad Company the defendant. The plaintiff set forth that he was unable to find a seat in any of the ordinary cars of the cars of the train while coming from Symouse to Auburn, and he took a seat in the Waguer drawing room ear. The conductor demanded extra fare from him, which he refund. The porter thereupon ejected him from the car, tearing his clothing, and indicting some slight scratch s, on account of which he sund the company for \$10,000 damages. The jury allowed plaintiff \$1000. According to this decision railroad companies are under obligations to farnish sents for all passengers, and if they are not to be obtained in the ordinary cars the drawing room cars may be occupied without extra charge. - Rochester Dem.

THE GILLUM MATTER.

A Compromist Proposed.

The visit of Mr. Gillum to our city has brought up the matter of his claim to a large body of property, embracing a portion of the San Pe dro Park. Maverick in Jane, A. D. 1868. In case the foregoing proposition is not accepted and carried into effect by or before


