## BUNKER HILL.

Reception of Visiting Military Bodies—Fraternal Interchanging of People From Various Sections of the Union.

BOSTON, June 16.—To-day has been given up to the reception of visiting military bodies, and from early morning the streets have been alive with gay uniforms, and resonant with stirring strains of martial music. The people of Boston, with much of the enthusiasm of the war period, have given themselves over to hospitality, and have welcomed military and civic bodies with an ardor quite in union with the patriotic spirit of the day, forgetting the differences of the past. The crowd which thronged the principal streets through which the visiting military paraded on their way to their hotels bestowed the heartiest applause on men from the South, and a wave of cheers swept along the masses crowded on the sidewalks and filling every available space from roof to pavement. The arrival of the Norfolk Artillery, escorted as their guest General Fitzhugh Lee, afforded the gratifying spectacle of the people of Boston paying an ovation to an ex-Confederate officer. Gen. Lee bowed again and again, as the applause greeted him on every corner.

The tattered battle flag of a Pennsylvania regiment, as it passed up State street, was also saluted with rounds of applause, and the spectacle of such an era of reunion and fellowship was one never to be forgotten.

A formal reception was given to the different military organizations at Columbus Square, Hon. Josiah Quincy making the address of welcome. Colonel Thos. Y. Simmonds, of Charleston, S. C., responded, promising henceforth and forever that Massachusetts and South Carolina will be one and inseparable for the perpetuity of the cause of liberty. His remarks were received with rounds of cheers.

At the conclusion of the address, the band played Dixie. The fifth Maryland regiment was reviewed on the common by Governor Gaston. While review was in process the Norfolk Cavalry marched within the enclosure amid rounds and rounds of applause, and, being formally presented to the Governor and staff by Major Follett, they also passed in review. The 5th Maryland regiment during the afternoon presented as a tribute to Massachusetts's dead soldiers, a magnificent floral design which was placed on the soldiers' and sailors' monument at Charleston by the commanding officer of the regiment, Colonel J. Stricker Jenkins. There had been no publicity whatever given to the affair, and when the flag was formed the command was ordered to fall in without being informed where they would march to. The regiment was then without escort, and marched to Charlestown, their appearance exciting curiosity in the streets. They were drawn up at the Soldiers' Monument, after bringing the command to a parade rest. Colonel Jenkins received from a florist a beautiful and costly shield, composed of white and pink flowers, about six feet in height, and placed it on the face of the monument, the Marine Band playing a dirge. Across the shield was the sentence, arranged in flowers, "Maryland's tribute to Massachusetts." Several thousand persons had been attracted to the monument, after the regiment was drawn up, and were usually gratified at the touching tribute so gracefully and modestly paid to the Massachusetts dead. After this impressive ceremony, the 5th re-formed in line and marched to the Common, where one of the distinguishing features of the day's ceremonies was the presentation of a flag to the 6th Maryland Regiment by Post No. 7 Grand Army of the Republic and veterans of General Bank's division army of the Potomac. The presentation speech was made by Gen. N. P. Bank.

Col. Jenkins responded, and in the course of his remarks said: "This standard will be received with enthusiasm by our people, as a tangible evidence of our brotherly love and benevolence, and its protecting folds, as in the days of the revolution, Massachusetts and Maryland will be folded together to die." The Mayor's reception, in Meigs Hall, to-night, was a grand affair. Welcoming speeches were made by Mayor Cobb and Governor Gaston, which were responded to by Colonel Andrews, of South Carolina, and General Fitzhugh Lee, of Virginia. The speeches abounded with expressions of good will, and were received with storms of applause. The men threw their

hats in the air and yelled themselves hoarse, while the ladies in the galleries waved their handkerchiefs and clapped their hands in patriotic fervor. Speeches were also made by Vice-President Wilson and General Sherman, Burnside and Kilpatrick, after which an informal levee was held by the Mayor. There are over 75,000 strangers in the city to-night, and hundreds sleeping upon the grass of Boston Common.
