General News Items.

KANSAS CITY LIVE STOCK.
Kansas City, Mo., June 19.—Cattle received, 295 head; shipped, 621 head. Market quiet and unchanged, buyers still holding off because of the situation in the Eastern markets. Sales: Retail lots of native cows at \$3.50 to \$4.50; good do, \$4.50; Texas cows, \$3.50 to \$4.50; do steers, good, \$3.25; fair, \$2.12.

A MAN SHOT WHILE ASLEEP.
June 20th, the Marshal, received news of a terrible murder and kindly furnished the following details regarding it. On Tuesday night last, Mr. C. W. Wood, of the firm of Cates & Wood, Denton, Wisconsin, was shot and killed, while asleep in his bed, by a man named Crockett. The assassin was prompted to the deed by a desire of revenge, but mistook his man and killed in his place his partner, Crockett had been confined in the jail by Cates (the partner of Mr. Wood), who was Sheriff of the county, and during his confinement in jail wore to kill Cates if he ever got out. Filled with a desire for Cates' life, he took the first opportunity after his release to accomplish his hellish design, and shrouded by darkness and at the hour of midnight, he, with stealthy steps, approached the house of his victim, who as he supposed was in his bed. Carefully he raised a window, and by the dim light he discovered who he supposed was Cates. He leveled his deadly pistol and fired, the ball taking deadly effect, and in the darkness he fled with his enemy, but did not escape. His wife, on being questioned, gave the information as regards his desire to kill Cates. Mr. Wood was a highly respected citizen, and his loss is deeply felt in this community.—(Dallas Com. 18th.)

YORK ARMY.
Berlin, June 16.—The trial of Count von Arnim was resumed before the Kammergericht today. The public prosecutor concluded his arguments. He demanded the imprisonment of the Count because he was guilty of embezzlement in the matter of abstracting documents received in an official capacity. After arguments for defense by Doebner and Munkert, the court announced that judgment would be delivered on 24th instant, and adjourned.

BERLIN, June 16.—The Crown Prince today gave audience to Admiral Warden and naval officer accompanying him. The United States Minister introduced the officers to the Crown Prince. After the audience the Americans were entertained at dinner at New Palace, at Potsdam. Admiral Warden and his officers will proceed to Hamburg on Friday, when the American squadron will sail immediately for the Baltic ports.

A more palpable truth was never spoken than by Archbishop Purcell, when in his official organ, he said: "Without the support which Catholics have given the Democratic party, and it will fall in this city, county and State, as speedily as it has risen to its long lost power and position." This was in March last, when the Chicago bill was under discussion and several Democratic members hesitated about supporting so objectionable a measure. Referring to this hesitation, the Archbishop goes on to say: "The Democratic party is now on trial." That was sufficient. The reculant members, thus threatened, yielded their convictions, and were whipped in by the lash ecclesiastical; the bill passed, "the world, as broken votes of the Catholics" was pledged to the Democrats and the leaders are now looking for success at the price of the party's abasement.—(Tribune Correspondent.)

His St. Petersburg organ, the Globe, declares that the three emperors have lost the power of guaranteeing peace "since one of them has been suspected of warlike designs," and it suggests a new alliance between Russia and England. It is not strange that this publication should create a "sensation" in Vienna, for it is really Austria, beyond a doubt, and not France or Belgium that the war party in Germany is anxious to whip, and if one of the emperors withdraw from the tripartite covenant he will only leave the other two to quarrel at their leisure. It does not appear, however, that the war is to be expected immediately. Bismarck has gone off to the country for his summer holiday, having assured the foreign representatives before he left of "peaceful disposition of Germany," and there is not likely to be a fight before his return, so that we need not add anxiety on this score to the other discomfites of midsummer.
