There are, how to be encouraged. ever, misguided zealots who persist from time to time in trying to fireb them into relations which they have never had and never ought to have in this country. These attempts have become so far a matter of public interest that political conventions are leginaing to taken or to safthe matter, The Republicans of Ohle devoted to it the only forcible and emphatic resolution in their platform, and the convention of the Republicans of California, which was held last week, gave very clear expression to the only sound destrine. The convention dealared that "the freedom of the State from ecclesiastical control is of equal importance with the maintenance of religious freedom from State control; that the common schools and institutions of leavising of the State were established as a preventive of the crime and poverty which attend ignorance, and we will tolerate no interference with them from any quarter; and that any effort to divide the school fund for the pursone of supporting sectarian schools with portions thereof shall be

the only one that is consistent with the spirit of our Government and our free institutions. The favor that is already shown to religious bodies, in permitting them to accomulate large amounts of propurty exempt from taxation and thus onsbling them to support themselves in part at the expense of the whole community is hardly to be excused on any ground of public policy. If it were not a matter long ago established, when the influence of the Church was more strongly felt than at present, but were to come up as a new proposition, it would not have a respectable minority to support it. Religious organizations have great and beneficient purposes, and deserve the voluntary supgort of all good ajou, but they should not command the involuntary contributions of unybody. Contributions to them should not only be voluntary but directed solely according to the preferences of those giv-

ing them. It is of the utmost importance

that religious, wership-should be free from

any State control, and, on the other hand,

met with all the resistance in our power.'

This is the only safe position to take, and

any attempt of Church organizations to influence legislation for their especial ben efit, or to exercise power over the administration of any matter of general public combern, should be absolved at its very inception. But the branch of this subject which is of most immediate interest is that which relates to our system or public education. This is intended, as the resolution above quoted rightly states, as a prevent ive of those evils which flow from igno rauce, and which, under a popular government like ours, are the source of vast mis chinf and no little dhuger. It is a matter which concerns the safety of the State and the well-being of every citizen, that those who exercise the rights of citizenship should be trained in a knowledge of their to duties and presponsibilities! The State it does well to provide for its education, What it flow in this remeat should be dans for all. The schools should be open to all without regard to their religious be lief, and should interfere in no way with the faith or worship of those who enjoy their benefits. They cannot secure those benefits equally to all and serve their full purpose if religious sects, as such, are permitted to centrol them in any degree. Letter from a Rio Grande Dem-ocrat Who is Serry.

BIO GRANDE CITY, June 14, 75. Editors Expression SIR :



The convention declared that "the freedom of the State from ecclesiastical control is of equal importance with the maintenance of religione irondom from State control; that the common schools and institutions of leavning of the State were established as a proventive of the crime and poverty which attend ignorance, and we will tolerate no interference with them from any quarter; and that any effort to divide the school fund for the purpose of supporting sectarian schools with portions thereof shall be met with all the resistance in our pewer."
This is the only safe position to take, and the only one that is consistent with the spirit of our Government and our free institutions. The favor that is siroady shown to religious bodies, in permitting them to accumulate large amounts of pro-perty exempt from taxation and thus ensbling them to support themselves in part at the expense of the whole community is hardly to be excused on any ground of public policy. If it were not a matter long ago established, when the influence of the Church was more strongly felt than at present, but were to come up as a new roposition, it would not have a respectable minority to support it. Religious organizations have great and beneficient purposes, and deserve the voluntary em-ject of all good med, but they should not command the involuntary contributions of strybody. 


