Proceedings of the City Council.

TUESDAY, July 6, 1875. Present, the Mayor, Aldermen Dashiell, Sweeney, Chavez, Schreiner, Degenar, Klumb, McAllister and Maschke.

The Mayor stated that he had appointed Jas. T. Thornton as agent of the City Council.

An ordinance providing for the removal of city officers was read and passed unanimously.

Local amateurs can give theatrical and dramatic performances, concerts, without being required to take out a license, provided the avails are to be applied to public, religious and charitable purposes.

A communication from G. Freisleben in regard to the bridge over the San Antonio Valley Ditch on Austin street was read, and a motion of Alderman Degenar, that the resolution passed at the last meeting of the Council, charging the amount above the contract price, be rescinded, was carried unanimously.

At the regular meeting of City Council held on Monday, July 6, 1875, the report of the Public Improvement Committee on resolution of Alderman Tait, to have the banks of the Madre Ditch elevated, was adopted.

Elm street is to be macadamized, and so is Water street and South street, and the work is to be let out to the lowest bidder.

Alderman Degenar wanted the matter laid over until there was money on hand to pay for it, which resolution was lost.

The Alamo Plaza is to be watered under the direction of the Ditch Commissioner.

Mr. Duffler is to be paid the amount due him from the city.

The matter of making assessments of Alamo and Valley Ditches was referred to a special committee.

The final account of Ed. Braden for macadamizing Water street was presented and approved in open council.

Pat Welch is to be paid for bridges and mason work on Alamo Ditch.

North 3rd street is to be graded and covered with gravel.

Mr. Kilman wanted permission to open a place of amusement on the West side of the Alamo—laid on the table.

Report of Committee on rock wagons was read a second time.

The City Engineer is instructed to report in regard to the extension of the drain on Convent street.

Ordinance providing for fencing City Cemetery was read second and third time, and passed.

After the 1st of July the money allowed the San Pedro Park is to be spent under the direction of the Mayor and Public Improvement Committee.

Alderman Dashiell moved to have the appropriation of \$50 per month rescinded, but it was lost.

A Committee of three is to be appointed to draw up an ordinance providing for the unspending of animals.

Meeting adjourned.

General News Items.

ACCORDING to the Chronicle, a New York insurance journal, of the 17th inst., the losses by fire in the United States and Canada during the month of May amount to \$9,384,800, of which amount insurance companies are liable for \$4,338,100.
