Continued. All I can say in regard to the manufac ture of botton is to mention here a paragraph taken from a communication made by Ms. F. Coignet to the Society of the Civil Engineers of the city of Paris, dated May 19, 1839:

"Certain parties have tried to make artilicial stones of agglomarated beton, but being actuated by a spirit of bad economy, some have suppressed the energetic trituration with compression, which is necessarg to produce a powder paste, have sontented themselves with obtaining without the necessary trituration a moist mixture of lime, sand and cement; while others have sought to replace it by compression obtained by the means of heavy pressure. 
