San Francisco, July 31 .- The etcomer Belgie, from Hong Kong and Yokohoma, arrived to day. Yokohoma dates are to July 21. The new deliberative assembly was opened on the 5th met. The depart ment of the interior buildings in Yeddo burn d on the 4th inst. A great number of ancient historical documents, of which no copies are in existence, were burned, together with the entire collection of maps upon which the surveying bureau had been engaged the past four years. Russian Commissioners are expected at Yeddo to complete arrangements for the transfer of Sagualies Island, newly acquired territory, which will for occupied as a ponul-

On the night of June 22d, a fire in Hong Kong desteoyed much foreign property, including the premises of Besself & Co. Loss estimated at \$350,000.

On June 19th this etdamer Carisbenickie trom flingapore, and owned by British subjects, was discovered funding passenger and cargo on the foliand of Bunds, which being closed to foreigners, the stiff was dearded and seized by English customs officials in the Chinese service, and pridered to Whampon for investigation. The captain of the Carisbrooks promised to follow a Chinese gun boat to that port, but presently endeavored to escape to Hong Kong. After saveral macuings his veusel was fired upon and dieabled and finally captured and taken to Whampon. Several hundred passengers were on heard, but none of them injured, shore being directed at the rudder only. There is much excitement among the English, though there are few who dang that the seizure was warranted, as the attempt to sninggle was elivious . The judicial investigation at Canton haveng resulted unestinfactory, the matter bas been referred to Pekin for Indgment.

The American Consul at Chin Kinnig, while walking with his wife recently, was assaulted with offensive language by a party of Chinese soldiers. The native police interfered, when a fight ensued between them said the saidlers, the Amerieans not being further molested. Two soldiers were attented and taken to the British Commission increases attent which place was seen surrounded by a military mob, demanding the rolesse of their companions. They were soon disbersed however, by one of their officers. Magnified reports of the affair having reached Shanghai, Counts Saward, American, and Med-bursht, British, proceeded to Chin Kiang, in American and British ships of war for the purpose of investigating the matter. 
