THE EXPRESSION OF THE SOUTH.

FRIDAY, August 20, 1875. Here is Dickens' pen portrait of Andrew Johnson: "I was very much surprised by the President's face and manner. It is, in its way, one of the most remarkable faces I have ever seen, not imaginative, but very powerful in its firmness, (or perhaps obstinacy,) strength of will and steadiness of purpose.

One of the foremost obstacles to the success of the Cuban insurrection is described as follows by the Louisville Courier Journal. "Don Julian de Zalaca, who was re-elected President of the Spanish Club the other day, is a millionaire and the most powerful man on the island of Cuba. He has four estates worth \$6,000,000, besides other property. He is at the head of the slave-holding interest, and directs all his efforts and the machinery under his control to avert a catastrophe to his interests like the abolition of slavery. The Spanish Club controls an army of soldiers in its interest, and constitutes the strongest bulwark which the insurgents will have to overcome, and an obstacle to foreign intervention in behalf of the patriots."

There is some quiet talk in Massachusetts about running Charles Francis Adams as a "Centennial" candidate for Governor this Fall. As an additional argument in favor of his nomination, the Springfield Republican makes this plea: "This is pretty certainly Massachusetts' last chance to furnish a President to the country during this generation, if she fails all time to come. Massachusetts' last chance, probably New England's last chance too. Political power is steadily and swiftly passing to the West, year by year. But Massachusetts, if she chooses, can stave off the inevitable a little longer. She can do it in just one way - by making the grandson of John Adams her centennial Governor. In doing this, she will thrust into bold relief against the background of our unenviable history a figure that even in retirement is too conspicuous for the peace of mind of the managing politicians. The historic name, the great associations which cluster around it, the man himself, ripe statesman, and incorrigible patriot, the centennial feeling in the air, the popular dissatisfaction with the mediocre and senseless in politics, the popular eagerness to celebrate the anniversary year by getting the best of all these elements in the situation warrant the belief that the election of Charles Francis Adams as Governor of Massachusetts in 1875 would mean the election of a President of the United States in 1876. Humanly speaking, it would be impossible for the politicians to help themselves. The map and the conditions combined would be too much for them."

Isaac Merritt Singer, the inventor of the Singer Sewing Machine died in England recently in the 64th year of his age. He was born in New York State, was a natural mechanical genius, and originated several useful inventions. He was a lover of the drama, and figured for several years in a stage manager and an actor. In 1850 he invented the sewing machine which bears his name and upon this invention he reaped a fortune that enabled him to pass his latter days in rest and elegance. His penchant for the dramatic work led him to the last and in the splendid mansion he built at 43rd St. and near Broadway, England, a theater, complete in all its appointments, was included. He was a liberal, kindhearted man, and his name descends to posterity as a great inventor.

Texas Beginning to Develop. We clip the extract below from an article in the Houston Telegraph, commenting upon the recent Horticultural exhibition held in that city. In view of our approaching Fair we hope our citizens will see the importance of bringing to light the development which is rapidly going on in Western Texas. The extract we quote is true in every particular:

"Eloquent eulogies, and high sounding generalities upon the productive capacities of the State, do not amount to much where the resources of the practiced writer, and the general tendency of the press to high coloring, is understood; but when the products of the field, orchard and garden are laid before the eyes, there is an array of facts which convince and satisfy the most skeptical.

"The first idea that would strike a thoughtful observer of the exhibition would probably be that a change was coming over the spirit of the producing classes; that we are in a transition state, and are moving with a most gratifying speed to a higher stage of agricultural development; that the day is rapidly passing away when the result of a year's toil will be staked upon a single precarious crop; that the true idea of farming is not to wrestle with cotton bales, but to produce the necessaries, comforts and luxuries of life; and that the man who produces what he consumes of fruits and vegetables, and who adorns his home with nature's own furniture, heightened by art, and ordered by taste, is another and a higher order of being than the mere slave of the cotton plant. Progress in this direction is most cheering.

"Another thought is that another producing interest is growing up in the State, that in it may be a half a decade, will rival the sugar, the wheat and the cotton interests. The immense capacity of the State for the growth of fruits in all their varieties, is flashing upon the conviction like a new revelation. The old popular idea that apples, pears and peaches will not grow, is exploded. The grape finds here its native soil, and exotic varieties submit kindly to culture, and reward the grower with munificent returns. Set out four orchards and plant four vineyards. Reach out for the finest varieties of every species. There are millions in it. The expanse of territory is here, the soil is here and the climate, and if enlightened enterprise is added to these, in a few years our people will live in luxury, abound in wealth, and with her surplus products supply the markets of the continent."

The Republican Victory in North Carolina. The recent Republican victory in the "old north State" is the most significant revolution in Southern politics which has occurred since Reconstruction.

North Carolina, like all the bal lance of the seceding States, passed under the control of the Republican party in the process of recon struction. But North Carolina had a majority of white voters, and the Republicans had to retain 40,000 white voters to maintain their power. The Southern Agrarian re action came and North Carolina, passed under the control of the "white democracy" and the "carpet bagger" "niggers" and "scalla wags" took back seats.

The democratic party failed in North Carolina, as it has every where else, to give the people as good an administration of the public affairs as the Republicans had, and to cover up their short-comings they proceeded to get up a Constitutional Convention to make a new constitution and do away with the hateful document framed under the operation of the Reconstruction act. The result of the recent election turns out a complete Republican victory, and a political change of over twenty five thousand voters. Democracy is on the decline in the old North State, not because of the "niggers" "carpetbaggers" or "scalliwags" but because fifty thousand of its white citizens have taken the sober second thought and de clared their belief in the principles of the Republican party.

This campaign which culminated in this glorious victory was fought upon the clear, well defined prin ciples of the Republican party. There was no pandering to "no party-man" or "conservatism," it was a straight, bold, gallant fight by the Republi cans, while the Democracy attempted to give their side a "conserva tive" tinge merely to catch timid men. All honor to the gallant Republi cans of North Carolina, they have taught the country a healthy lesson.

Another job of King-making and Constitutional tinkering is going on in Spain. They are used to this kind of work in that country. In about seventy years Spain has had four dynasties, including the family of Don Carlos, Carlos VI and Juan and Carlos VII - the latter the present Don Carlos - never reigned in Madrid, but held the royal sceptre. They were surely paper kings, parchment emperors. During the same period there were also several provisional governments and one short lived republic. Constitutions have also appeared and disappeared with the quickness of summer lightning. Before one was more than read another took its place. Each revolution of the military or political wheel brought with it some change in the organic law of the kingdom. But in no case were the people permanent benefited. Those in power reaped the harvest and the masses starved on bread and garlic. They were cheated by General Prim when they aided him in driving the Bourbons from Spain, and they have been deluded since that time with the idea of coming freedom. And the present Constitution is a mere cheat and delusion. The people of Spain will receive no benefit from its adoption. The Bourbons never respected Constitutions. To them written or unwritten law is alike valueless. They rule by "divine right," that is by force and the sword. It is well enough to have a Constitution at which the people can look as something to protect their rights. But that will never alter the mouth of royalty. If the people of Spain wish to enjoy the rights of freemen, they must drive both Alfonso and Don Carlos from the country and take the government in their own hands. Constitutions granted by tyrants are only chains, whips and scaffolds in disguise.
