

DIMENSE WHEAT CROP.

St. Paul, Minn., Ang. 27.—The Commissioner of Statistics has just issued an official statement of the acreage and yield of wheat and oats, and the acreage of corn for 1875. He gives the total actual acreage of wheat at 1,762,327, an increase over 1874 of 81,205 acres, and estimates the gross yield at 32,000,000 bushels, or an average of a trifle over 18 bushels to the acre, the largest yield ever known in the State. The yield in 1874 was only 23,955,957, or about 14 bushels to the acre. On the above basis the Commissioner estimates a surplus of 24,000,000 bushels, an amount (Continued on fourth page.)
