Sept 3, 1875. SIR: I have the honor to acsnowledge the receipt of your letter of the 18th ultime, transmitting a memorial from the Board of Trade, of San Antonio, Texas, (endersed by Generals Augur and Ord,) relative to postal service in Western Texas; referring more especially to the routes from San Antonio to Eagle Pass, Fort Conche to El Paso, Fredericksburg to Ft. Concho and

San Antonio to Fredericksburg. In reply, I have to state, that the Postmaster General is desirous of giving all necessary postal service on the routes named, and is making every effort, that is possible under existing laws, to secure such service without unnecessary delay. It is evident that the abandonment of service by the contractor on the routes from Fort Concho to El Paso, was in pursuance of a preconcerted plan to prevent the result that would ensue from fair and honest bidding for the service, and to defeat the Department's efforts to secure service at reasonable rates of compensation : the persons engaged in such combination against the interests of the Department, hoping that such state of affairs would (with the aid of memorials and petitions from those suffering the loss ot usual postal facilities) force the Postmaster General to the action that was necessary to effect the acountlishment of their object. On route No. 31138 (San Antonio to Eagle Pass) a contract for twice a week service, each way, has been ordered, to take effect on the 1st

proximo, and further trouble as regards that route is not anticipated. On route No. 31140, (Fort Conche to El Paso,) the offer of service made July 31st, 1875, to bidders whose proposals, under the advertisement of Oct. 1st, 1874, do not exceed \$30,000 per arnum, failed to secure a favorable response, and on the 1st inst, the Postmaster-General extended the limit of compensation, (beyond which proposals are considered " too high," and offered the service to bidders whose proposals do not exceed \$35,000 per

annum. Under the last offer, a contract for the service will doubtless be

secured. As regards routes Nos. 31,139 (San Antonio to Fredericksburg) and 31,436, (Fredericksburg to Fort Concho,) service seems to be performed in accordance with the terms of the respective contracts, and the complaints received relative to that service, vefer principally to the mode of conveyance used, and to the delay caused by the increase in the number of hours running time, as allowed by the prescribed schedules of departures and arrivals. To obviate all diffi culty, the complaining parties seem to see no remedy, except by giving the service to those who are so anxiously waiting to get it, at the old rate of pay: a remedy which the Postmaster General does not pro-

pose to apply.

The mode of conveyance to be used in carrying the mails on the rontes named cannot, under existing laws, be prescribed by the Postmaster General; a fact which does not seem to be understood by those who so urgently petition for service which will give commodious cosches, suitable for rapid and satisfactory passenger transit; a matter wholly foreign to the pur-pose of this Department, the prov-ince of which is simply to secure the transportation of the mail, with certainty, celerity and security, at

na low a rate of pay as possible.
In conclusion, I would add, that the cause of the temporary reduction of service on the routes from San Antonio to Engle Pass and from Fort Concho to El Paso, to continue until responsible contracts for the service can be secured, in accordance with the provisions of law, is doubtless greatly misunderstood by the citizens interested in such service; and parties who are guilty of the unscrupulous acts that necessitated such reduction probably misrepresent it as being an arbitrary and unnecessary action.

It can be readily understood that the reduction of service referred to will result in much temporary in-convenience and dissatisfaction, but I feel assured that the final result will be greatly to the benefit of the postal service, and demonstrate that the Department is not to be controlled by any combina-tion that may be formed for the purpose of preventing the proper Fairbanks' Standard execution of the law governing the award of contracts for postal service. 
