From the Bench and Bar of Texas. 1 Hardin Hart.

In 1872 Col. McCoy appeared be-fore Judge Hart in the Dallas Distriot Court for the detendent in the case of the State vs. Force for carrying a pistol. Judge Hart, during the progress of the trial, referred to it as a case for "packing a six-shooter," Col. McCoy had imbibed numerous "cock-tails," mint juleps, etc, and was in a proper condition to worry the court if he took it into his head to do so, Judge Hart spoke to him very roughly several times during the trial and excited his ire, but he was too much of a Chesterfield to show it. When Col. McCoy began his argument. he said : "Gentlemen of the jury, this is a case for packing a six shooter; that is not the exact language of the indictment, but that is what

his Honor calls it." He said the law against carrying arms was an infringement on Con-stitutional rights. Speaking of the Constitution reminded him of the Declaration of Independence, which in turn reminded bim of its author. "Gentlemen," said he, "Thomas Jefferson wrote. "All meu are born equal;" that means that they have equal rights to the blessings of beaven; to the babbling brooks and refreshing breezes; and that all men ought to be equally protected by the law in the enjoyment of their natural rights. It does not mean that all men are equal intellectually, physically or morally; it does not mean that that negro sitting back there in the window is the equal of his Honor."

Judge Hart-Col. McCoy, you nust stick to the pint; this court has forborn with you till forbearance has ceased to be a virtue."
"Will the court allow me," said

Col. McCoy in his blandest tone, to apologize to that freedman, or rather to explain myself, for I didn't nean to institute any comparison between him and this court, and he may have misunderstood me?" Jerry," said Judge Hart, addressing Sheriff Brown, "take that

man out of here." Judge Hart believes that Judge Lipseemb was the best lawyer that ever lived, and he placed implicit confidence in his opinion.

Under a special statute of Texas to cut a man with a "bowie knife" is punishable in twice the amount fixed for assaults made with any ordinary deadly weapon. In the case of the State vs. Caliwick, tried at Fert Worth, 1872, the proof was that the cutting was done with what is commonly known as a butcher knife, and the counsel for the defense insisted that it was not a" bowie knife" within the meaning of the statute. Judge Hart said: "Gentlemen of the jury, I charge you that any kife, except a pecket knife, that will cut guts is a " bowie knife.

Judge Burford represented the plaintiff and Judge Ferris the de-fendant in a case in Judge Hart's court in Tarrant county. Judge Ferris, who lived at Waxahachie, had not arrived when the case was called. Judge Burford said that he disliked to take any advantage of the defendant; he was sorry that Judge Ferris had not arrived, but his client was anxious to have the case tried. Col. Sweed asked what case it was; on being informed, he said that be was associated with Judge Ferris iv that case, and that his client informed him that his witnesses sere present; and, if so, he was eady for trial; he had also learned that Judge Ferris had just arrived and would probably be in the court house by the time the jury was empanelled.

Out of the greatest interests of the present Convention, and of the next Legislature, is, to provide a public school system which will allow all the children of the State to go to school for ten months in the year. We entreat members of the Convention, if they value their reputation, to look after this matter.


