When the noble old Quaker stood ander the treaty tree in Penn's wood, binding the Indians to him by the terms of peace and good will, the Franciscau fathers were here laying the foundations of the magnificent structures whose towers, buttlements, keeps and spires fill the observer te-day with wonder and admiration. The vast country between this and the Atlantic was then one unexplored wilderness, To-day Philadelphia blazes with the fire and power and progress of the Nineteenth Century, while San Autonio still site veiled in the soft, pearly haze of the renance and poetry of the past. There is nothing like her on this continent. In Mexico the ancient has not touched hands with the modern. In the United States the present has absorbed the past. 
