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TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

News From all Parts of the World. Associated Press Dispatches.

GALVESTON KEEPS 16 INDIANOLA. Galveston, Sept. 23.—The citizens here, who were appointed at a meeting held for the relief of the Indianola sufferers and other towns, have succeeded in raising \$3,378 in money up to yesterday.

At Austin, Texas, and other cities in the interior of the State, we hear of citizens actively engaged in aiding people in the submerged districts west.

One of the Morgan steamers, it is expected, will leave for Indianola Friday or Saturday with additional supplies for the destitute. Contributions from the interior will be sent here for shipment to them.

Parties left here yesterday in search of Rev. Dr. Alexander and family, who were living on an island near Lynchburg, and have been missing since the storm.

The pilot boat, Eclipse, which was driven ashore at East End, is being hauled off well, and will be afloat to-day.

DEAD BODIES. The body of a little boy was found six miles down the island, and the bodies of two men between Shoal Point and Campbell's Bayou.

The Captain of the bark Edward McDowell, reports the vessel lying in nine feet of water, and expects no difficulty in getting afloat as soon as the cargo can be lightened.

At Holivar Point no lives were lost. All the small boats were driven ashore. ORPHAN ASYLUM DAMAGED.

The Orphan Asylum, six miles down the island, suffered considerably. It was washed off its foundation and damaged in the lower story. The out-houses washed away.

On Friday evening the Mother Superior of the Asylum was in the city, and went down on horse back at the risk of her life, with what provisions she could carry.

To-day's Galveston News contains a card signed by W. G. Irvin, which gives a history of the manner in which the first news from Galveston in relation to the late storm was prepared for the Houston market.

The exposure of C. L. Martin is full and complete. It has been ascertained the same party manufactured the specialties sent to the New Orleans Exposition September 16th from Houston. Those specialties were simply a condensed budget of falsehoods, written up and telegraphed to injure Galveston and her people.

Marshall, Mich., Sept. 24.—A fire broke out in the office of the Herndon House about 3 a. m., cutting off all outside communication, and burned very rapidly with very dense smoke.

Memphis, Tenn., Sept. 21.—During the past few days letters and telegrams have been received here inquiring if there was any epidemic prevailing here.

A special to the Appeal from Helena, Ark., says: During the latter part of last Fall, two men named Deason and Strader, and a difficulty at Forest City, Ark., in which Deason shot Strader in the arm, causing it to be amputated.
