and England are exactly in the same cou-dition in which we find ourselves here, and I believe that in both cases the reaons for the decay of trade are the same."
"Is there any chance of revolutionary movements being set on foot or of any re-newed display of energy on the part of the International?"

"The International seems to be pretty actively at work in large munifacturing enters, but otherwise no revolutionary dements are to be noticed—at all events not in Germany. Most of my friends, re-fugees of '48, have quietly returned to Germany, a faw only still remaining in England. Both categories, however, have quite settled down. What the prospects and the plans of the International are I cannot say, for I have not seen either Carl Marx or Engels in London."

"Did you find any particular great dis-play of bragging in Germany, er of Renom miren, as your language so sicely puts it? Any desire to go to war with France

"Of Renommires there is a little, but not much. As to a new war, I am satis-fied that the German people don't want it. But the opinion which has been prevalent here as well as in Europe, that the conomical conditions of Germany have been unfavorably affected by the war, I believe to have been erroneous. The working power of Germany is immense, and has not been perceptibly affected by the loss of life during the war. On the other hand, the system of obligatory military service has been so long applied in the country, that it has quite entered into the oustoms of the people, and can no the customs of the people, and can no longer constitute a disturbing element in Montgomery, is washed away.

"Of that Eastern business I have scarce ly any idea at all. I was in Switzerland when it broke out, and afterward at sea, so that you must be here much better informed than I.
