The resurrection of the stories concerning the loves of Germany's greatest literary genius may be a little ungracious, but they are quite interesting. It is said that quite interesting. It is said that they began even in his boyhood. At sixteen he was over head and ears in love with a girl named Gretchen, of a very humble rank in life-indeed, her satroundings hadtaints of criminality. While he was at college, both to Leipsic and Strasbourg, he was engaged in all sorts of wild amours and frolics. on so with the daughter of a dancing master, Subsequently he became sequinted ith solving man at Sesswicim and had two daughters, to one of whom Goothe became ongaged, and, sulced, was betrothed to her. But when in 1771 he left the university he tore bimself away from the young lady and speedily forgot her. After his removal to Watzlar, and the production of "Gotz von Ferlich agen," he fell in love with Charlotte Puff, who was betrothed to Herr Kestner. Him she subsequently married, and Goethe was for a time inconsolable. A young student named Jerasalem, with whom Goethe was intimate, having committed suicide because of a sim ar unhappy passion for the wife of one of his friends, Goethe we've the incidents into the we!l-knowa "Sorrows of Werther." Two love engagements followed in quielt succession-bus with Anna Sybilla Manch, and the other with Anna Elizabeth Schonemauer-im-

mortelized o his works under the "Lille" "to latter seems to have everted a tyrannical sway over the poet. Those who have read "Lill's Menagerie" will recollect his ludic crous confessions on this point. In 1775 Goothe went to Weimer by the invitation of the Grand Duke, and thence forward that charming little city was his home. "Here," says Krebel, "every body worshiped him, especially the women." His "affairs of the heart" were literally innumerable, and few of them ended merely with the heart. The most noted of his amours were those with the Frau von Stein and Christiane Vulpins. He had long maintained intimate relations with the former, but as the latter bore him a son in 1788 he married her in order to legitimize the child. Frau von Stein was a lady of culture and in-telligence, taking a position in the highest circles in Weimar; but the woman whom Goethe married was low and uneducated, and, indeed, had lived as a domestic in his house. Goethe never thought there was anything wrong in these amours. He was a "free lover" in the truest sense of the word, and,

indeed, justified free love in one of the most beautiful books that he wrote - the "Wahlverwandschaften," (" Elective Affinities") - in which the charms and graces of his style are employed in the descrip-tion of the impulses which spring duty in the relations of marriage. By the title of the book, and the whole spirit of it, he would represent that sexual affinities follow the same inevitable law as the chemical affinities, and that humanity strnggles impatiently against the dictates of nature. And the book was not
