Signor Bertolotic, a venerable Italian, unwards of sixty, in connection with the flex, has established a European reputation. The exhibitor is a genial old man, with a voice modified by long intercourse, with his minute friends; his hand, though large, possesses an exquisite delicacy of touch and he bends over and fondles his singular pets as though he felt a real affection for them. In 1832 he bagan the training of fleas in England, and amassing a considerable fortune retired from professional life. Recently times have gone hard with him, and again he summens the fleas to his rescue. The professkillful manipulation, are thoroughly violated in a short time or no female fleas (male fleas are discarded as utterly intractable,) which were brought from Canada, the professor making the delightful an-nonucement that fleas are extremely scarce in the United States. The performance yesterday opened with a passage at arms between Dom Quixote and Sancho Panza, two bloodthirsty fleas, that mounted tiny paper horses attacted each others with speers. The tiny paper horses being stationary, no great damage was done to either one of the contestants, but the fleas really appeared actuated by deadly hatred and whirled the little spears about in a furious manner, Next an illustration of the immense strength of the creatures was given in the performance of an herculean flea, who, harnessed to a little gilt chariot, weighing just 1,200 times his own weight, drew the same about the table. As an agent of locomotion, however, the flea is not as much of a success as in some other particulars, for its legs, being centered in the immediate neigh borhood of its head, there is an unavoidable slovenly appearance about the way in which it carries the re-mainder of its body; and besides, the natural gait of the flea is that of the angile kangaroo, and it can never be trained to assume a comely trot. However, the little creature shambled around with the chariot, and one of its fellow saton the bost, as dignified a driver as ever cracked a whip.

> one that had never received any educational advantages. Its habit was still that of the creature who lives only to hop and bite, and a chain and ball attached to the hind leg told of its unfitness to associate unrestrained with its civilized brothers. The chain and ball were of gold, the former being just one inch in length and containing 400 links." On the same microscopic plan all the paraphernalia used was constructed, little hats and coats fitting with remarkable nicety. Other of these remarkable insects were made to turn cranks and hoist buckets. But the chef d'oeuvre of the entertainment was some two dozen fleas at a ball. At one end of the ball room was a complete orchestra, each flea holding its peculiar instrument in readiness for the dance. On the floor two couples were seen, and on a tinp sofa another was engaged, at least so said the professor, in a very desperate fliration A music bex was then set in motion, and at the first sound the little insects began their respective vocations, those on the floor whirling about in the dance and those in the orchestra working their legs, to which were attached the instruments, in a most enthusiassic manner. When the size of the flea is remembered the task of handling them at all will be apprecited. Fortunately they are as tough as porcupines, and can be unceremoniously picked up with little steel pincers without danger of hurting them. The average lifetime of a flea is about eight mouths, and as four months is required in subduing their spirits and altering their gait from a hop to a trot, it will be seen that the process is an endless one.

Of the 800 fleas in this collection about half are performers and have to be taken from their harness of threads once a day to be fed. Their fodder is nothing less than the blood of the professor, who permits the whole flock to browse on his laft arm every morning.

CAMP OPPOSITE WATCH MOUNTAIN, ? LLANG CO., Oct. 25th, 1875.

Mr. Putman, is engaged quite extensively in raising cattle and hoge; the latter receiving special attention at his hands and thriving accordingly. Report of Cot. Blutter. HEADQUARTERS SCOUTING EXPEDITION, LAGUNA SABINAS, Texas, Oct. 19, 1875. Col. J. H. Taylor, Asst. Adjt. Gon. Dept. of Texas, San Antonio, Texas:

Sta-I have the honor to report that I spensible position. Col. Shafter, it seems, destroyed last night a camp of sixteen lodges which had been abandoned by the Indians the night before in great haste, as they left everything.

About fifty sacks of mesquite bears three or four thousand pounds of dried meat, about one hundred buffalo robes booking utensils, &c., and one hundred good lodge poles were burned.

Upon my arrival at Laguna Quates on the P. M. of the 15th inst., I found the large springs were entirely ruined by the buffaloes tramping them up, so that by putting all the spades into use digging Court this morning owing to the fact that out the springs, it was two o'clock in the merning before I got the command wathe cases set for to-day. Attachments tered with one bucket full each, and with a detail of fifty-four men bard at work, was only able to water once, all the ani mals wanted, by 3 o'clock P. M. of the 16th.

He then fastened his own horses and crept into the Indian camp, and succeeded in getting twenty-five horses, the most of them good ones, and four fine mules, which be started on the run for my camp, distant 33 miles, reaching me about 9 A. M. of the 17th. I at once left with the command, reaching the subinas with 25 men just after dark, to find the camp abandoned and everything gone. The main command got in about 11 o'clock P. M., and the wagons early the morning of the 18th.

> In looking for the trail yesterday the camp of sixteen lodges referred to, was found about six miles off, and a party sent out to destroy it. This camp was evidently left on the P. M. or night of the 17th, upon the approach of my party to ing the system when thus subjected to inwards the north end of the Laguna. The trails are running South and South west, and I follow this P. M. in two columns of about ninety men each, one following the trail and the other going to the southwest to the spring where I found the Indinns on my last scout.
