BEN. BUTLER.

FAITH IN HIS STAR-A LITTLE STORY.

The fact that Butler is not a member of the next House does not seem to desract in the least from his popularity. His law-office is constantly crowded, and many find it more difficult to have an interview with him than to see President Grant. Had he twenty brains like his own, and as many pairs of hands and eyes, with a constitution and physical like Hercules, he would still have more than his share of work. Somehow or other people of all shades, of politics have faith in Butler's star, or rather in his ability to achieve success. I heard a story the other day, which is but a sample illustration of this. Taking out his his own \$2,500 fee and stuffling it into his vest pocket, and giving the balance to his client, with the advice that he should take the first train for Baltimore and thereby avoid the numerous Washington sbarks always lying in wait for such prey, Batler proceeded to the court to argue the injunction. abolition of slavery. All other questions and interests are subor-10. The President does not meditate the annexation of Cuba to the United States, but only desires her

freemen in harmony with ourselves and the other republics of America." 11. Our attitude is now one of expectancy but may at any moment be changed to one of action.
