A New Mexican Ranch.

A letter-writer, who has been visiting New Mexico, tells some marvelous things about the ranch of one Mr. Chisum, who is, perhaps, the greatest herdsman in the world if the writer speaks the truth. "The man of thy land of Uz" was not a more prosperous "King of Beasts"

To the southeast of Santa Fe, near Fort Stanton, is the famous Chisum cattle ranch, containing about sixteen hundred sections of land, on which Mr. Chisum has, at this time, eighty thousand head of cattle. He claims that he can fill an order of forty thousand head of beeves, sent him by telegraph from New York, in ten days' notice. Be that as it may, he is the "cow king" of Mexico, to use a pro-vincial phrase. He employs, in all, about one hundred "cow boys," and "cow punchers" - and in other words he employs mounted men to picket the ranch day and night, winter and summer, to see that the cattle do not stray off the pasture selected by him for his own use.
