The Grand Jury and the President.

The Federal Grand Jury at St. Louis, which indicted so many whisky conspirators, among them General Babcock, the President's Private Secretary, being re-elected all parts of this district, and a number of them Democrats, signed the following letter, which was sent to its destination:

UNITED STATES GRAND JURY ROOM, ST. LOUIS, Dec 9, 1875. U. S. Grant, President of the United States, Washington, D. C.

The undersigned late United States Grand Jurors for the Eastern District of Missouri, in discharge of their sworn duty, have found it imperative upon them to present to the United States Court of said district the names of many officials, and other persons, as being connected with a conspiracy to defraud the Internal Revenue of the United States.
