It will be seen by the resolutions adopt. A sectioned Press Disputches ed at the Republican meeting on Saturday night last at Meyer's Hall that the Republican party of Bexar county not only decline to nominate a party ticket for coan ty and district officers, but that they also scommend the Republican State Convention, to meet at Houston to-morrow, not to nominate a party ticket for State officers. This action was had, too, in a full meeting, attended by a large body of highly intelligent and influential men, among whom were several of the m at prominent and talented public men of the State.

Such action is unusual, remarkable, and highly significant, when the animus of it is thoroughly understood. It amounts to a virtual disbandment of the Republican party in Texas during the precanvass for the coming State election. It mems to indicate a tacit understanding of that party that it will reserve its strength and its action until the canvass begins for the Presidential election next Fall. This is the most logical interpretation of such action that we are able to find, and, we uppose, is the real meaning of it.

Several reasons have contributed to this indisposition to an organized and active course at the present time. The party is in a hopeless minority in the State. But this does not justify any party in a course of non-action. Other reasons exist. publicans generally not only oppose the new Constitution, but they do not believe it has the proper legal sauctions, and theyare not willing to weaken this position by

party cauvaes under it. And, worst of all, the party is hopeless ly demoralized and divided under its present organization; and it will continue to drift into anarchy and disolution until there is a change for the better, if such a thing is possible. The strong men, the honest and good men, "the apostles and elders" of the party, are divided into fac tions, and making war upon each other. The rank and file, the bone and sinew of the party, the honest, intelligent and earnest Republicans, consulting their peace and their self-respect, content themselves with supporting the national principles and administration fo the party, ooking upon its present State organiza tion as a hopeless wreck, in which they

on neither risk their personal honor nor their political fortunes. Of course, when a party makes no or gaulzed contest in favor of a regularly minated party ticket, the individual nembers of that party are left perfectly free to act and speak and vote as they phoose. Especially is this the case in local elections. The Republicans of this county have declared themselves undependent of partisan nominttions for local officers. This leaves each Republican free to vote for the men of his choice, whether they be nominated in a party convention or in a nass-meeting of altizons. It is expected that the Govern ment will "intern" him as it did the Bishop of Paderborn, unless he prefers quitting the country. The whereabouts of the Archbishop of Cologne is still a secret. The Volks Zeitung invites the diocesans desiring to present him with their New Year's felicitations to leave their cards at its publishing office for transmission.

A FAMOUS PUNCH-BOWL.

There has been discovered in the posession of a lady in this city a curious onyx punch-bowl, which was once in the Duke of Brunswick's collection, and the certificate, written in Latin, in 1682, by the town clerk of the city of Brunswick shows that this tyase was owned by Mithridates. The collection to which it belonged, according to Plinus, was taken from Pompeli to Rome. The vase fell into the hands of a soldier, who sold it to Duke Francis Albrecht of Saxe Lauenberg, for on hundred docats. It passed from his wife, the Princess of Mecklenburg, to the wife of Duke Augustus of Bronswick. In 1776 it was in the Ducal Museum of Brunswick. It was taken to England and then returned to Ger-many in 1815. It was lost sight of until it was found in Geneva among the relics of Duke Charles. The bowl found its way to New York, and after changing hands several times, was purchased by its present owner.


