PERSONAL.

Jesse Pomeroy, the Boston tormentor and murderer of other children, has not yet been hanged, though still under sentence of death. He has lately been examined by Dr. O. F. Folsom, an expert in insanity. Folsom has written an article on the subject for the Boston Medical and Surgical Journal. He declares that Pomeroy labors neither under delirious mania, nor the mania, which is the result of self-abuse, nor epilepsy, nor moral incapacity, nor from weak-mindedness. He is sharp witted and cool and malignant beyond measure. He is without any excuse on the ground of lunacy, and in fact wholly responsible.

Mr. Harrison Grambo, of Philadelphia, who died recently of consumption at the early age of thirty-one, was a most remarkable business man. He embarked into real estate speculation, starting with a capital of about \$1,000. In two years he was enabled to fit up a magnificent office, and include a general banking business along with his real estate operations. He continued to prosper until April 1875, when he failed for \$800,000. A couple of months afterward he made a settlement with his creditors, paying seventy-five cents on the dollar.

Julia J. Thomas, of Cornell University, New York, won the first prize for proficiency in the study of the Greek language at the recent intercollegiate contests in New York. J. M. Selig, a student at Yale College, recently became heir to an estate in Boston valued at nine million dollars, but will not come into full possession of his property until he is forty years of age. Ten thousand dollars per year is his income until he reaches the period named in the will of his father.

Six years ago an Italian steamer City of Boston sailed from New York, for Liverpool, having on board between two hundred and three hundred persons. After touching at Halifax, where quite an addition was made to the passenger list, nothing more was ever seen of the vessel, or any one of those who took passage in it. Ever since that time the general acceptance of the theory of the ice has been that a collision with an iceberg caused the ship to founder. But, now, by the explosion of the case of dysentery at Bremerhaven, a more horrible solution is suggested. Investigations at all points are being made to see if any clue can be formed to substantiate the charge that the terrible fate which the vessel so narrowly escaped was to be but a repetition of that which carried the poor mariners of the City of Boston to their watery graves.

THE MEETING OF SHERMAN AND JOHNSON. An interesting account of the meeting of General Sherman and Gen. Joe Johnston at the Railroad Convention at St. Louis, is given by Captain John Kirk, of Madison, who was a delegate to the Convention. Kirk says that when Sherman came upon the stage, there was great cheering, but mostly from the Southern delegates, as Sherman's figure was more familiar to the residents and Western delegates, and his presence did not attract very great attention from them. But the vociferous cheering of Sherman by the Southern delegates evoked an enthusiasm, and when, in a few minutes, General Joe Johnston, of the Confederate Army, who was as our readers know, commanding the Southern army opposing Sherman, came upon the stage, the cheering was loud and prolonged. Captain Kirk says that as Johnston stepped on the stage opposite Sherman the latter made a rush for him and they met in the center of the stage, and, rushing up to each other like old friends, warmly and heartily and strongly shook each other by the hands, and Sherman, in his enthusiasm, almost picked Johnson up and set him in the chair immediately beside him, where they sat side by side during the session of the Convention.

MISCELLANEOUS. The late Gulliver of Baroda was supposed to have had the most magnificent coat ever made in India, valued at six lakhs of rupees, or \$275,000, which was sent as an offering to the shrine of the Prophet at Mecca. But this coat is about to be occupied by one lately made for the Maharajah of Patiala, which, a correspondent of the Delhi Gazette tells us, is "fifteen lakhs" (\$75,000), set with precious stones, and fringed about the edges, and sent with large beads. The coat will be worn at the Durbar of the Prince of Wales.
