FARM AND HOME. VALUABLE RECIPES. SACON FOR PUDDING.—One cup of powdered sugar, and one-half cup of butter beaten to a cream, with one egg beaten and added, then the white of the egg beaten and added, melt over the tea-kettle and add half glass of wine.

EXCELLENT CORN MUFFINS.—Two cups yellow Indian meal, one cup flour, three eggs, four tablespoonfuls of sugar, and a little salt, a piece of lard or butter the size of an egg, one tablespoonful saleratus and two of cream tartar (the cream tartar must be put in dry with the flour, and the saleratus mixed with a little warm water, and put in last of all); mix all together with milk as thick as pound cake batter, pour in corn, muffle pans and bake in a hot oven about fifteen minutes.

BOILED FRUIT PUDDING.—One quart crushed wheat, one teaspoonful cinnamon, half teaspoonful cloves, two cups sugar, two eggs, one-half pound suet chopped fine, one teaspoonful cream tartar, one-half teaspoonful soda, half cup full of molasses, half a pound raisins, chopped fine, citron, or lemon-juice, if desired. Boil two hours.

Permit me to say a word about the wheat as a food for daily use. I fear that people do not know how much they might be indebted to it as a medicine as well as a nourishment.

BOSTON BROWN BREAD.—Three cups of Graham, three cups of Indian meal, one cup of flour, one cup of molasses, one quart of cold water, a large spoonful of baking powder sifted into the dry meal, and boil for at least four hours in a tin pail, well buttered, covered tight, and set on a piece in a pot of boiling water, when the water is removed it must be boiling.

FILLING FOR LEMON PIE.—Rub smooth in some cold water two tablespoonfuls of corn starch, and stir until it looks clear. Pour into a dish, add two cups of sugar and a small piece of butter. When almost cool add the yolks of three eggs, juice of two lemons. Save the whites for frosting.

GRAVY FOR ROAST BEEF.—When your joint is "done to a turn," dial it and place it before the fire, then carefully remove the fat from the dripping-pan, and pour the gravy into the dish, not over the meat, as is the custom of inexperienced cooks, who, moreover, not content with this, ruthlessly drown it with a cupful of boiling water or highly flavored made gravy. This is a valuable error, for there is always a sufficient quantity of natural gravy in good meat to render the use of foreign sauces superfluous.

SOUP MILK CORN CAKES.—The following are splendid: Stir into three pints of corn milk sufficient meal and flour, two parts of the former and one of the latter, to make it of the consistency of unbaked pound cake. Add one teaspoonful of salt and one teaspoonful of thick cream. Dissolve two teaspoonfuls of soda in half a cup of water and stir into the batter. Put into butter pans having the butter about an inch thick. Bake in an oven one hour. Half this quantity will be sufficient for a small family one meal.
