CONGRESSIONAL.

Washington, Jan. 25.—House—Merrill's bill directs the Secretary of the Treasury to retain the coin in the Treasury until it amounts to 2 per cent. of outstanding legal tender notes, and in the meantime it suspends the resumption bill until after January 1877. It also requires the National banks to retain the coin interest received on its bonds deposited in some circulation to the amount of their legal reserves, and such sums in addition thereto as with the legal reserves shall equal 30 per cent. of their circulation, which amount of 30 per cent. the banks are to make as security for redemption, so as to be in full of the legal provision from the time that the banks have 30 per cent. in coin of their circulation.

New York, Jan. 25.—Late particulars regarding the burning of the Ingersoll building says that the building was located in South Norfolk County, and was destroyed a few years ago by J. H. Ingersoll, and was owned by Louis Ingersoll. The building was valued at \$100,000, and the furniture at \$40,000. A large portion of the furniture was saved. The fire is believed to be the work of an incendiary.
