SPAIN AND CUBA.

It has already been seen by our tele-graphic dispatches that the Spanish government is rapidly bringing the civil war with Den Cartes to a close. The motive for the great vigor recently manifested by the royal army to doubtless the desire to crush Don Carlos and then take up Cuba, as quickly as possible, to prevent in-tervention in Oute by the United States In pursuance of this idea the Minister of Foreign Affeles has neut-a memorandum, dated 3d Pehruary, to Spanish representatives abroad, instructing them to read it to Foreign Ministers, and leave copy, if requested. The memorandum, after point-ing out that the Caban Insurgents were no longer led by natives, but foreign adventurers, that negroes, mulattos, Chinese and desorters form the bulk of the insurgent forces, states that the army contains scarcely eight hundred white Cubana, while more than 40,000 of the latter are serving with the rayal volunteers. Spain cannot submit to any terms with such elements. She can only, after having obtained a complete victory, grant to Cuba all the liberties which, but for the insurrection, she would already possess, and which the neighboring island of Porto Rico, where slavery has been entirely abolished, fully enjoys, Reinforcements, numbering 28,000 men, have been dis patched to Cuba within twelve months. Notwithstanding the insurrection, trade has doubled during ten years; the more fertile parts of the taland have been un touched by the manrrection, and only a few districts have suffered from it; all foreigners sustaining losses will be indemnified, and the embargo on foreign goods will be raised. The memorandum is considered as an indirect reply to the last note from the United States.
