However, the same Committee speak favorably of the bill for the protection of agriculture against injurious insects, and if Hon, Gustave Schleicher, our Representative, can induce the above Committee to place the grasshoppers of Western Texas on the list of injurious insects, perhaps there may be still hope left for us in Congress. If Congress can control the government of men, why can't it exercise a similar influence over the operations of the members of the gryllidæ?
