SOUTH-WEST TEXAS

ITS AGRICULTURAL, STOCK-RAISING, RAILROAD AND GENERAL INTERESTS.

As our readers are aware, the EXPRESS is devoted to the work of making known to the world the attractions and advantages of that vast, rich, beautiful and healthful region of country known as West Texas.

The Rockport Transcript has a very interesting article on the South western portion of this great section of country, devoted to the promotion of a railroad from that point on the coast to the Rio Grande.

Speaking of South-west Texas, the Rockport Transcript says that Aransas Pass is considered by all to be the natural outlet for all the products of that vast section of country south of the San Antonio river, and extending to Laredo, on the Rio Grande, and for many miles below.

The section of country referred to has not been heretofore regarded as well adapted to farming purposes, yet it is capable of supporting a dense population of agriculturalists.

But there has been too little inducement for men to cultivate the soil in the absence of railroads to transport the products of the soil to market, especially when cattle could be raised with so little labor, and could find a ready market at home.

The first move towards the building of a railroad through this country would stimulate the farming interest. The fine valleys of rich prairie land would soon be tenanted with thousands of thrifty planters and towns and villages would spring up along the route as if called into being by the magic touch of an enchanter's wand.

The writer also mentions the vast coal fields commencing a few miles above Laredo and extending forty miles up the Rio Grande. Several tons of this valuable coal have been carted to the coast and has proven to be of the canal variety. It is inexhaustible in quantity, but for want of a railroad it is permitted to sleep undisturbed.

See I find cotton can be successfully cultivated all along the coast, and out in the interior to the Rio Grande. On the latter cotton of the common variety is raised successfully, and would be cultivated largely on the upper Rio Grande, above Brownsville, if the country enjoyed any transportation facilities.

Laredo is no mean city, and with the town of Nueva Laredo, on the Mexican side of the river, has a population of perhaps 10,000, and is doing a considerable business. A correspondent informs us that many fine buildings have gone up in the city within the last two years, yet for want of a railroad to develop the trade of Northern Mexico, and to draw it in this direction the progress and prosperity of the place is checked.

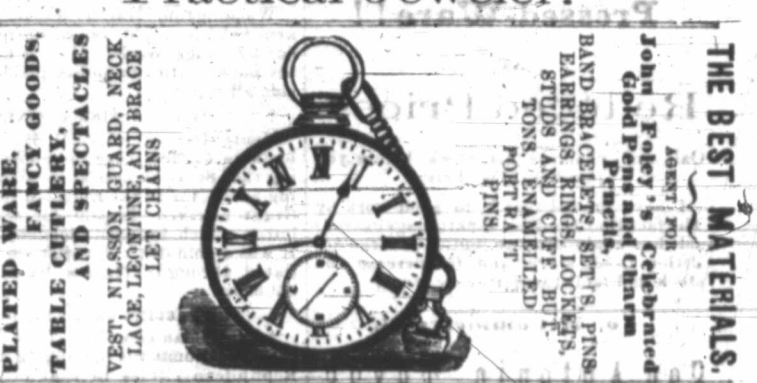

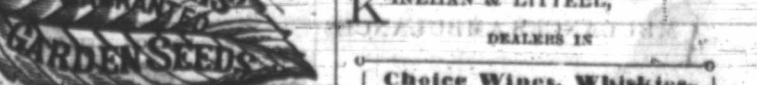

HANGING A MINISTER

HOW THEY SERVED THE WINSLOW OF A HUNDRED YEARS AGO.

[From the New York Observer.] To tell the story of Mr. Dodd, who was hung for forgery in 1777, may be quite out of time in the beginning of the year 1876. But there is a purpose in it, and perhaps the story and the moral will prove to be timely, though the event occurred just one hundred years ago save one.

After being ordained he was made rector of the parish of West Hill, near London. There he proved to be so eloquent that he was soon called into the city and became one of its celebrities. With his popularity and prosperity he was more and more extravagant and reckless in his style of living. To meet his expenses he engaged in literary work outside of his clerical duties; he was made tutor of young Philip Stanhope, afterwards Lord Chesterfield, and at length was appointed Chaplain to the King. Chesterfield became his best friend, or worst; got him through many troubles, helped him to money and to his ruin, of course—for, when he wanted more than his patron would give him, he committed a forgery upon Lord Chesterfield for \$20,000, was tried, convicted and executed. Great efforts were made to save him. The jury recommended him to mercy. Noblemen, clergymen, and 23,000 citizens of London petitioned the King to interfere, but the Government declined to do so, and the reformed criminal, under the laws of the time, was hanged at Tyburn June 27, 1777.

TURKISH CHILDREN

During all their tender years the children are brought up entirely in the East, and their education is imparted to the mother. A marked distinction is observed between Turkish children and European children. The latter, rosy, plump, and healthy, are absolutely unknown in the East. He would be considered a lusus nature. In fact, the children are often told that they ought to be seen, but not heard; but it is only in the East that this phenomenon is realized. Respect for his elders and a behavior around him is in harmony with this injunction; respect in the very air he breathes, and unless there are European children in the neighborhood, there is no fear of having their children tormented by the evil communications of a Christian child, not because they are Christian, rather because they are not Christian children; it is not the least powerful motive which prompts the Musselman to pitch his dwelling away from their habitations. One indirect consequence of this mode of education is that the children in the East are remarkable observant. As they are not occupied in jabbering they observe, and their naturally remarkable gifts in this direction are thereby developed. It is for this reason that you often see little urchins in the East helping their parents in complicated domestic duties at an age when their counterparts in Europe are kicking their nurses and blowing their trumpets in perambulators.

Waco, March 3, 1876. Last night at 12 o'clock Police-man McGhee and Deputies Moak Wright and A. Dutton attempted to arrest two suspicious characters, who were getting ready to ride out of town. One of them drew a revolver and shot Moak Wright through the bowels. He died this morning. Both horses were wounded, one fatally and the other seriously. Fifteen or eighteen shots were fired between the parties.
