ORIENTAL WRECKEDNESS AND FILTH—THE SLUMS FROM WHICH JOHN CHINAMAN IS POURED UPON OUR WESTERN COAST.

When we walk through the great cities of America and see the poverty and filth of certain quarters, we shrink with disgust at the repulsive sight and marvel that human beings can exist at all among such squalor.

A CHINESE FUNERAL. We see coming up the street a funeral procession with natural and unnatural mourners; first a ponderous coffin, resembling seven feet of the trunk of a tree, well barked, a little thicker at one end than at the other, slung on bamboo poles, which rest upon the shoulders of men who keep step with a loud "ho, ho, ho," and following that from six to a dozen wheel-barrow bearing the mourners, sometimes as high as four to each barrow.
