The Empress Ann died in 1740, after reign of ten years. She was in many respects a true Romanoff dissolute in morals, crafty and treacherous in politics, and with a beart absolutely inscusible to pity. To punish Prince Galitzin for having embraced Catholicism, she compelled him to take service among her pages, and to become one of her buffoons. She afterwards torced him to marry a woman of low extraction, and on the nuptial night caused them to be seized and entire night. She caused an officer, named Vonitzin, to be burned alive for having embraced the Jewish baucheries, and cemented with the faith, a Rabbi who converted him blood of his nobles, and even the lass sharing his fate. Of the Regency govering in the name of the infant VI,it is not necessary to speak here. It was overturned by the Princess Elizabeth, daughter of Peter the Great and Catherine. Ivan passed his whole life in prison, and was finally brutally assassinated, in 1763, during the reign of Catherine II.

Elizabeth occupied the throne twenty years, and her whole life was occupied by two shameful passions, a scandalous libertinism and the immoderate use of spiritous liquors. She had many lovers, and ber example made her court the most dissolute in Europe. Following the family custom, she took her overs from the streets, and from her arms they went forth grand seignors, She was illiterate, and the slave of prejudice and superstition; she was all her life agitated with terror of death; she was frequently intoxicated, and her favortes took advantage of her superstitious fears to govern her as they wished. The apologists of Elizabeth pretend that during her reign the leath penalty was suppressed. The truth is, it was replaced by the more horrible punishment of torture. The question ordinary and extraordinary was maintained, and during her reign Siberia was peopled with over twenty thousand anfortunate examples of her clemency. Madame Lopoukin, one of the most beautiful worren in Europe, for a pretended conspiracy, was condemned to be knowted, to have her tongue cut out, and then to be sent to Siberia.
