A FORETASTE OF THE MILLENNIUM.

A rather singular and somewhat unusual scene was witnessed in the town of Niagara recently at a funeral. The unusual part of the affair consisted of an Orange and a Roman Catholic society taking part in the proceedings. A prominent young man named James Scott, Master of the Young Britons Lodge, in that place, died, and it was decided to bury him according to the ritual of the Orange Society. He was a member also of the Union Temperance Lodge, and his Society determined to attend the funeral. The funeral was, therefore, a very large and respectable one. The members of the St. Patrick's Temperance Society acted as pallbearers, and three Young Britons. The Britons had headed the funeral cortège, and the Orangemen appeared in the usual regalia of the Order. The ceremony at the grave was conducted by Brother Henry Day. It was pleasant though unusual to see such harmonious action upon the part of societies which are so far apart and widely dissimilar in their views upon religious observances and old-time ends. INTERESTING TO TRAVELERS.

Philip A. Madan, arriving in this city on the New York and New Haven Railroad, gave the check for his baggage, while in the train to the agent of the New Transfer Company, at the same time receiving a receipt on which was printed clause whereby the company limited its liability to \$100 for loss of baggage unless a special contract was made to the contrary. A MAN HANGS HIMSELF TO ESCAPE HANGING.

EASTON, Pa., April 17.—Theodore Garren, of Hutchinson Station, N. J., next door neighbor to Jacob Young, who was found in his house murdered in April, hung himself this morning. A Justice was found in his pocket stating that he knew some people thought him guilty of murdering Young; that although he was innocent of that crime, he committed suicide for fear of being arrested and punished for a murder for which he had been exonerated. The unnatural feeling which existed between Garren and Young and the former's actions since the murder gave rise to a suspicion that he had committed the crime. Garren had not been in sound mind for several days. He was about seven years of age and leaves a wife and five children.

GRANGE ITEMS.

The State of Ohio reports 5,000 granges, with a membership of 60,000.

Collier (Mo.) Grange No. 100 recently learned that a former member was in a collecting condition in Texas, and generously appropriated money for his relief.—Ex.

Tennessee has 1,900 granges. Conducted as they are, in the interest of agricultural and good, economic, honest government and without partisan bias, the solitary effects of their influence are visible in every direction.

Florida State Grange invited immigration to her luxuriant orange groves and healthy climate, and points with pride to the most variety of delicious fruits in the United States territory, with sugar lands rivaling those of Cuba.

Many subordinate granges throughout the country have passed resolutions declaring it the duty of the National Government to pass a law fixing a uniform rate of interest for the entire nation, not to exceed six per cent, per annum, under the clause of the Constitution to regulate commerce.
