The murder of Senator Turchett in Louisiana is a sad and shameful affair. A little more than a year ago Sheriff Twitball and two other Republican officials, were hung in North Louisiana. A case of bloodshed seems to be coming upon the country.

The French are about to get "even" with the English in Egypt after all. It is supposed the French financial scheme has been adopted in that country as against the English, and it is highly probable the French will buy the balance of the Suez Canal shares.

On last Saturday night Jas. M. Brown, Sheriff of Lee county, while performing the duties of his office, was shot from his horse by parties in ambush, 5 miles from town, nine shot taking effect upon his person. Wounds severe but not mortal. Many shots were fired. A State Police is becoming an absolute necessity.

PUBLIC MEN AND THEIR TROUBLES

BRISTOW AND BAYARD.

The United States, for the past few months, has been washing her dirty linen in the eyes of all the world. The result is saddening to every patriotic American citizen. A great deal of guilt, corruption and irregular fattening upon the public treasury have, doubtless existed, and some of these things have been discovered and traced home to their authors.

We believe that all the aspirants for the Presidency, of both parties, have had suspicion attached to their names, with the exception of Senator Bayard on the Democratic side, and Secretary Bristow on the Republican side. They both still stand as "bright particular stars" in the midst of a political firmament over-cast with the storm-clouds of detraction, suspicion and corruption.

The latest one is what is called the Mary Merritt case, and is now under-going investigation. The Chicago Tribune of the 29th April calls this "an infamous plot" to ruin Mr. Bristow. It says that there is the strongest evidence of a combination having been effected between the Whiskey Ring and certain investigators at Washington for the purpose of blackening the name of Bristow before the people.

JUDGE DEVINE.

Judge Devine has won the admiration of the whole State by the lofty dignity with which he has conducted himself in relation to the Senatorial election. Although his name has been prominent before the people of the State for the position of United States Senator, and always mentioned without opposition, without criticism, but with high praise, he has steadily adhered to his first position.

An important case, growing out of "the late unpleasantness," was decided in the United States Circuit Court at Nashville a few days since. Judges Emmons and Trigg pronounced the decision in the case of the Northern Stockholders' Union and Farmers' Bank against the Directors of those banks for conspiring with the demands of Gov. Isham G. Harris in 1861, to purchase over \$1,000,000 war bonds of the State.
