WONDERFUL SALT MOUNTAINS OF NEVADA.

One mile above the ferry the Virgin River comes in from the North, and on and near it, perhaps, the most wonderful and extensive of salt formation on the continent.

MOUNTAINS OF SALT.

Hard rock salt, which is blasted and quarried out like granite and marble. Commencing six miles up the Virgin River, these mountains of salt extend for thirty miles or more up the Virgin and Muddy Rivers.

FORMATION OF THE SALT DEPOSIT

is no doubt very ancient, dating back to years beyond computation. Long since the deposit was made, the great upheavals and earthquake era have occurred, which have changed the whole appearance of the country for great distances around.
