

YE OUDEN TYME.

QUEST OF NEW SPAIN AND TERRITORY,

We have the translation of a copy of the proceedings of the general government of New Spain, issued by the Secretary of War, and now in the archives of Bexas County, giving an account of the early settlements of New Spain, lying between Central America and New Foundland. As the document is one of considerable length, and as many portions of it wouldbe of little interest to many of our readers, we only publish such portions of it as are interesting to all because of its close connection with the history of our immediate condition. The following were the profatory remarks to the order :

In compliance with metructions, your Excellency may give neries orders to Governor to observe the most punctual care in keeping the Frenchmen within their limits, not allowing them any tres pass under any consideration whatever; using all kinds of adequate means to that end, having always the number of garrison and missionaries complete, because negligence in this particular may cause very serious consequences. The greatest activity and diligence should be used to induce Spanish families to settle permanently on those frontiers, so as to afford more safety and comfort to the colonists using the utmost exertions to pacify the bostile Indians, converting them to our holy faith, levalty and obedience, and applying them afterwards to honest and useful occupations. But with the under standing that, in fulfilling this order, it must be strictly recommended to the missionaries, garrison and Spanish settlers, to use the mildest means in treating and dealing with them-being all this o great importance to the service of both Majorties. For all of which, sull confidence to placed in the capacity and energy of your Excellency.
