a general massacre of the Christians. Yesterday General Ignatieff, the Russian ambassador, embarked his children aboard a Russian dispatch boat for Odessa. The General himself and his wife remain, but the wives of the Secretaries of the embassy have been sent to a place of safety.

The reported recall of General Ignatieff is not confirmed. Insulting and threatening letters reach him daily from various quarters, and he is certainly exposed to imminent danger. Zealous Muselmans regard the Government's resolution to quash the sentences of the Salonica authorities as evidence of subservience to the European powers, from which an aggravation of their hostile feelings toward Christians may be justly apprehended. The aspect of things here becomes more serious every day.
