eyes. Don Carlos smiles very frequently while he speaks. He was dressed in a simple cheap suit of Scottish gray, such as many a clerk at A. T. Stewart's would despise, but sported a rather gorgeous black necktie. He wore two simple rings, and silver bolos as cuff-studs.

MANNER OF THE PRINCE. Don Carlos' manner is exceedingly lively and his gesticulation is incessant. Often he would tap your correspondent on the arm when calling his attention to some particular point he was making. "I know your correspondents who was with our troops," he said, speaking in a rapid, easy fashion. "Mr. McGahan is a charming young man. He was a man of splendid courage, and my soldiers all liked and admired him very much."

Don Carlos then asked numerous questions about Mr. McGahan, showing that he took great interest in his career. Don Carlos then gave an account of his American trip.

HIS AMERICAN TRIP. "I arrived in Halifax," said he, speaking French, "went thence to Boston, from Boston to Chicago, down the Mississippi Valley to New Orleans, from New Orleans to Vera Cruz and thence to the City of Mexico. In Mexico I had a charming reception. The people fairly rivaled each other in heaping kindness upon me. They gave balls and receptions in my honor, and showed me every possible attention. I had determined to travel incognito through Mexico as I have through this country, but it was impossible—there were so many that knew me. I was the first Spanish Prince who had ever visited their shores, which probably accounts for their kindness. I intended to visit Chile, Peru, and the South American countries generally; but the amiability of the Mexicans, and the length of my stay, so that finally I had no time left to finish my programme, but had to return to Europe."

"How soon do you intend to sail for Europe?" "In about two weeks. I was going to tell you about my return trip hither. I went from Mexico to Vera Cruz, thence to New Orleans, and from New Orleans I came here by way of Richmond. The scenery along the Potomac, which I viewed from the steamer, was superb, more especially Mount Vernon, with its beautiful historical associations. By the way, do you know that it is hotter here in Washington than it is down in New Orleans?"

"Yes, and probably you feel the heat more than ever you did in Spain, 'Prince,' the correspondent replied. "Yes, I do, Don Carlos said. I have enjoyed my trip through the country very much. It is full of interesting and instructive things. I am only sorry that I can make but a flying visit, but I have to regard home in my wife, where a joyful event awaits me."

BOX CARLOS' CHILDREN. This last monument of Don Carlos, made with an expression of pleasure and pride. "I have already five children," said he, "and this will be the sixth."

Your correspondent remarked that Don Carlos looked remarkably youthful. "I married when I was eighteen," said he, laughing, "and I am now twenty-eight."

The correspondent quoted the custom of ancient Sparta, when mothers who gave the State the greatest number of citizens were distinguished and rewarded. Don Carlos returned joyously that if this were so now, and were applied to fathers as well, he would certainly claim his reward. He then asked the correspondent to be seated, and, seating himself also, continued the conversation with great animation.

THE REASONS FOR HIS VISIT. His attention being called to the stories that had appeared in print, that he had come to America for the purpose of establishing a throne in Mexico or in Cuba, Don Carlos said, with some indignation, mingled with amusement, that this was a great error (foolishness); that he only came to America for instruction and pleasure, and that such a thought had never entered his mind. The imputation of disloyalty to Spain seemed to wound him, and he declared that no true Spaniard would desire for a moment that Cuba should be torn from Spain, or that the Spanish Empire should be thus dismembered.

"I am a Spaniard before anything else," he replied, proudly. "There is no difference between Spaniards. Whether we are Monarchists or Republicans, Alfonsists or Carlists, we should all strive to rob Spain's diadem of its most precious jewel. Besides," said he, "I am not in search of a throne. I only claim that which rightly belongs to me; and, with significant buoyancy, he exclaimed, 'to attain that throne I have by no means given up hope.'"

"The war is over?" the correspondent remarked, interrogatively. "For the present," Don Carlos returned, significantly. "For many years I suppose?" "The answer to this remark will be the one that will most interest the reader in Europe. In a tone, the deep significance of which it was impossible to misunderstand, he said, after a pause of silence: "That depends upon circumstances."

The correspondent asked Don Carlos without pressing the ques-

tions as to the continuance of the war any further, what he thought of the PRESENT CONDITION OF SPAIN. "It is very unsettled; but this much seems to be clear—that Alfonso can not maintain himself long on the Spanish throne. Spain seems to drift toward a republic just now."

"A republic after Castelar's model, Prince?" I asked. "Not so moderate, I should think. You see, Castelar is a man of great boldness of thought, but little boldness of deed. He proclaims grand doctrines of political liberty; but when he comes into power he does not possess the force to carry them into execution."

THE CONDITION OF EUROPE. From Spain the conversation reverted to the general political condition of Europe. I think there is just now great danger of a great conflagration in the East," said he. "The East is like a powder magazine, in which a match has been dropped on the floor. You may go for years without disturbance, if you do not tread upon the match, but you may step upon it in the next hour, and then a terrible explosion is sure to follow."

METEOROLOGICAL.

There is a constant discussion of meteorological points by many persons, who pass judgment upon the characters of the seasons and weather probabilities, not from information based upon the comparative records of years, but from opinions, which are consequently incorrect, upon immediate changes, discarding past revolutions.

For instance, the present season is said to have rained much more than during past years. Our rain has fallen favorably to agriculturalists. But before the meteorological year is past, a dry spell will certainly come about to dry up the water-fall of 1876 approximately to that of previous years.

The meteorologist keeps annual, and not daily or monthly records, to guide him in compiling his reports upon the seasons. Through the kindness of Dr. F. Peterson, we are enabled to give our readers a comparison of the past eight seasons. It will be plainly observed that none of the great changes have been wrought which many are inclined to believe have taken place.

Mean temperature for eight years, 68.96; mean annual rain-fall, 36.15 inches. Maximum temperature in 1875, 103°; minimum, 15°.

These numbers being substantially the same, it may be concluded that, although there are large variations from year to year, as shown in the table, they will, on the whole, neutralize one another, when very long periods of time are considered.

The amount of rain-fall not only influences, in a primary manner, the growth of plants, and, therefore, agricultural pursuits, determining the profitable cultivation of many different crops, but it also exerts an influence on several manufacturing operations. If, therefore, the above statement be correct, no apprehensions need be entertained of a permanent disturbance in these particulars, although in the last thirty years great changes have taken place in all portions of the United States.

It is the belief of European meteorologists that the rain-fall on the western portion of their continent varies little, if at all, when periods of many years are considered. The rain-fall at Paris, for instance, was found not to have altered in one hundred and thirty years.

In England, there are rain-fall records reaching back to 1677. Since 1775, there are more than 1500 rain-gauge stations in that country. The Scotch observations extend to 1731, and the Irish 1791.
