UNIVERSITY BOAR MEET.

Washington, July 19.—At Saratoga the 1000 yards race was won by the Cornell team, Harvard and Columbia 2d, Union 4th, Wesleyan 5th, Princeton 6th and last. The time of Cornell was 27.4, Harvard 27.5, Columbia 27.6, Union 27.7, Wesleyan 27.8, Princeton 28.1.

The Saratoga Lake single scull race was won by Francis Cornell.

The Saratoga Lake Freedom race was won by Cornell, Harvard 2nd.

Washington, D. C., July 19.—Senator After the expiration of the meeting hour resumed consideration of the articles of impeachment against the Secretary of War.

The Senate adopted the conference report on the army bill. There are now left the Legislative, Supply and Executive, West Point, and River and Harbor bills.

Brown of Kansas who has charge of the Platt bill, Canada report, will call it up on Saturday. It is supposed the agreement will occupy three days.

The Judiciary Committee will report favorably on the bill placing the awards of medals of the Mexican campaign in the same relation to the Government as original. These claims are about seven millions, and are now held at 10 to 25 cents and no purchase. Should the proposed bill pass, they will be worth 47 cents, in great savings and insurance companies will stand to gain by them. Large amounts have been sold, containing upon the passage of this bill.

San Francisco, July 19.—The Board of Marine Surveyors has decided that the Pacific mail & S. City of Takon, owned and operated by the same party as the City of Peking will be sold.

FOREIGN.

POSTPONED PARLIAMENTS.

London July 19.—A dispatch was sent on a large meeting of delegates yesterday afternoon at Manchester, and intended to discuss the question of wages one month.

The Eastern War.—Serbia has sent the last number of 50,000 to the front; 4000 Egyptian and 5000 Serbs have left Salona for the front.

Romania has mobilized 200,000 men.

The recent earthquake affected the Banat basin from Passau to Buzov to Presburg in Hungary.

The Montenegro war on Monday interrupted. The Montenegrins were in the field, as Montenegro is not a neutral.

Russia, July 19.—Dispatches from Tokyo announce that the Japanese have abandoned Saragawa without fighting. The insurgents have fled into Gatsubo.

London, July 19.—Capt. Stead, leader of the British League for Peace, was arrested at Plymouth on May 21st on the charge of attempting to incite violence in the voyage from Melbourne to New York, and after a prolonged examination committed for trial. He was acquitted at the Devon Assizes yesterday, the jury saying that although the circumstances were a conspiracy, they were not satisfied about his guilt.

Lithuan, July 19.—The U. S. steamer, Maria, is here, all well.

OUR criticism and condemnation of the administration of Gov. Coke are considered by the least type of partisan prejudice. We know that this State is everwholly Democratic, and that the Governor, whoever he may be, will necessarily be a Democrat, and we are just as eager to support a good Democratic Governor, and a good Democratic administration, as the strongest Democratic journal in the State. But Gov. Coke is not the man and his administration is not the government that Texas urgently needs. It is a failure, the worst failure as a Governor that Texas ever had, and that Texas is suffering disaster from his wretched administration of public affairs, is now recognized by every sensible and sane man in the State. We say it not in scorn, not in anger.

Should the Fifteenth Legislature now convene in Texas, and the Pacific lobby corruption, it will become a disgrace to the people of the State. The demand of the people of the State for the recovery of their public lands from the corrupt management of the Legislature is not a new one. Nobody in the Legislature will vote for any extension of time, or for continuing the land grant in any shape or form, without serious consideration of the just and emphatic condemnation of the people. The people demand the recovery of their public lands, the opening of them for settlement, and the consequent encouragement of immigration and capital to flow into the State. The eyes of the whole people of the State are upon the Legislature in reference to this matter, and they cannot be deceived. The people never did and never will consent to the alienation of their lands to this country.

Five Cows.—The *Republic* says that the crops of Gonzalez county have not been as promising since 1852-53, as they are at present. An abundance of corn has been made and several lots have already been engaged at 25 and 30 cents per bushel. The cotton crop promises to be unusually large. We learn that it is now good for one thousand pounds to the acre, no matter what mishap may befall it. The cane crop is also doing finely, and promises a heavy yield. With the large surplus of corn which we shall have, and the heavy mass, hope must necessarily be cheap and fat next fall.
