NOON DISPATCHES. GRAND DEMOCRATIC RALLY. New York, July 26—There was a large Democratic rally meeting at Tammany Hall last night.

CONGRESSIONAL CAMPAIGN.

TRAVIS COUNTY SELECTING DELEGATES TO THE DISTRICT CONVENTION—THE MAJORITY FOR HANCOCK.

ASTORIA, July 22, 1876. The Travis County Congressional Convention met. Carlton called the meeting to order, and Outman was elected permanent chairman; Archer, secretary.

Carlton proposed a dozen names as delegates to the District Congressional Convention, announcing that they were all Hancock men, and elected because they were Hancock men.

Archer proposed the plan as unfair; the minority should be represented. He said he favored Finley, and if Finley men were in the majority, he would not be willing to outvote the minority in such a matter.

Mr. Hirschfeld proposed a substitute that delegates from each precinct select their delegates to the district convention.

Results: First Precinct, John W. Brown, J. Fowler, Thos. E. Rowe, and Jas. Brown. Second or Austin Precinct—Col. El. Holt, Geo. Shilby, Bertha Chandler, Jon. Walker, Jas. West, Judge Speed, G. S. Burdick, Dugan, Bruggesser and Carlisle.

Third Precinct—James D. Easton, L. S. Woodward, Jas. D. Doney. Fourth Precinct—McNuckala, Millan and Zivney.

Fifth Precinct—T. E. Smith and D. A. Todd. The delegation elected is for Hancock, except the third precinct, which will give two votes to Finley or Shepard.

THE CITY OF MEXICO. LINDO RE-ELECTED PRESIDENT BY AN OVERWHELMING MAJORITY.

DEATH OF A REVOLUTIONARY. HAVANA, July 22—Mexican dates of the 14th say the general aspect of affairs is in favor of the government.

Gen. Riva Palacio's revolutionary army was surprised and defeated by Col. Adolfo Valle at a point about two days' march from the capital.

Gen. Alatorre saved himself only by plunging into the river. Gen. Chavarria second in command, with several staff officers, fifteen soldiers, and two hundred horses were captured.

Gen. Alatorre is looking after Gen. Figueroa, who has interrupted during the last few days all communication between Orizaba and Vera Cruz. Figueroa has notified the railroad company to stop all traffic on the line, and that if trains are run, it will be at the risk of the passengers' lives and destruction of the road.

Trains, on this notice have only run to Orizaba, but the government has taken measures to divert the money.

It is proposed to run a diligence from Orizaba to Vera Cruz. The official published report of the secondary and presidential election given by the Journal de Tejas is overhwhelmingly in favor of Hancock.
